 An <u>explanation</u> of the transition to Common Core-aligned Regents examinations has been prepared.

ITD (CNYRIC)

- Technology Integration Leadership seminars have been <u>scheduled</u> for the summer, including

 - o Going Mobile
- Full calendar of workshops here

Curriculum, Instruction & Assessment (CIA)

- Has a <u>service</u> for next year that will support implementation of the Expeditionary Learning modules
 - o Integrated professional development and resources approach
 - Initial overview session
 - Coaching, classroom visits, on-going technical assistance
 - Facilitation of data team meetings
 - Module overviews and lessons
 - Student and teacher text
 - Class sets of handouts
 - \$1500/teacher for year one; \$1000/teacher for subsequent years at same grade level
 - Materials- printing and texts at OCM BOCES cost
 - Participation confirmed by June 1 for 2013-14
 - Specific modules (within 2 and 3) confirmed by August
- PBL^{NY} demonstration site project was described
 - 16-24 Teachers receive 3 days of PBL 101 in the summer of 2013 (OCM BOCES' Common Core PBL), including training materials
 - o Teachers will collaboratively develop a Common Core PBL unit for 2013
 - Teachers will collaboratively develop a Common Core PBL unit for spring 2014
 - Teachers will receive ½ day release time per month for planning purposes (and/or to meet with PBLNY coach)
 - Coaching for any additional units
 - o Units will be with other PBLNY schools, in person and on-line archive
 - PBLNY coach will spend one day per week in the school building assisting teachers with their projects, offering resources for projects and helping with the implementation of projects.
 - The cost of one year is \$28,000 dollars, based on 40 days at \$700 per day custom, on-site rate (can be done at a half-level with 20 days for \$14,000)

Standards (Remember: Adopt, Adapt, Refer)

- SED continues to add math modules, little by little
 - Availability of first ½ year of all materials by late July
 - Availability of full year by December
- For math:
 - o The Vendor Fair is May 10th. Registration in MLP is now live.
- Making Decisions About Educational Materials
 - Plan on a morning presentation about the Connie Muther <u>process</u> of materials selection. Not yet in MLP, but soon (as soon as the contract is signed)
