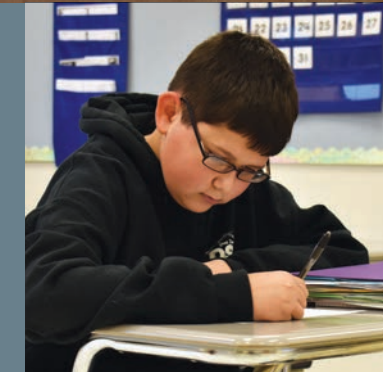

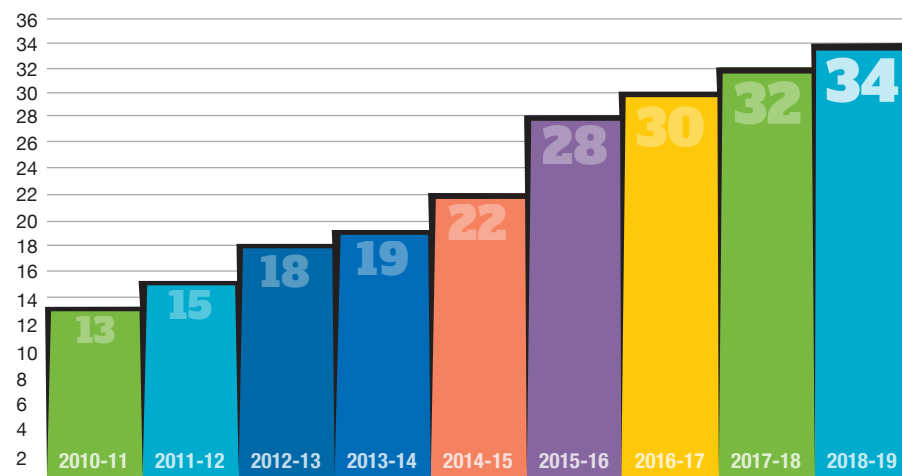
Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

Brooke Unger is a junior at Innovation Tech who loves a long list of qualities about the school, including its close-knit environment, the diversity of its student body, the access to technology, the close bonds she has established with her peers and facilitators, and the wide variety of experiences that have helped her feel "both ready and prepared for life after high school."

Her guidance counselor, Kayla Beyer, says Brooke's confidence in herself and her desire to attend school has improved tremendously since she first joined the school three years ago. In addition, her grades have soared.

"I see the passion in Brooke when she is completing a project, working with her peers, or presenting in front of her class," Beyer said. "She has a great spirit and carries herself in a very professional way."

Brooke's goals including attending Onondaga Community College, then continuing her education to become a surgeon. Brooke has researched this goal extensively at Innovation Tech, where she is also taking a self-directed, virtual chemistry class through Seven Valleys New Tech Academy, another BOCES program in Cortland. She is also taking a college-level reading class to help her prepare for the rigors of a post-secondary education. Last year, one of her projects, called "The Human Heart," was selected for a presentation in front of a large audience at the school's "Exhibition of Excellence" held at the OCM BOCES Main Campus.

In addition to her high-quality coursework, Brooke has also made a big difference at Innovation Tech through her active involvement in the Friends of Rachel (FOR) Club, a group that strives to promote a positive school culture. She also volunteers in the community whenever possible.

Her math facilitator, Candice Clark, says Brooke stands out. "Brooke has become a leader amongst her peers, promoting kindness and bringing out the best in others and herself," Clark said.
