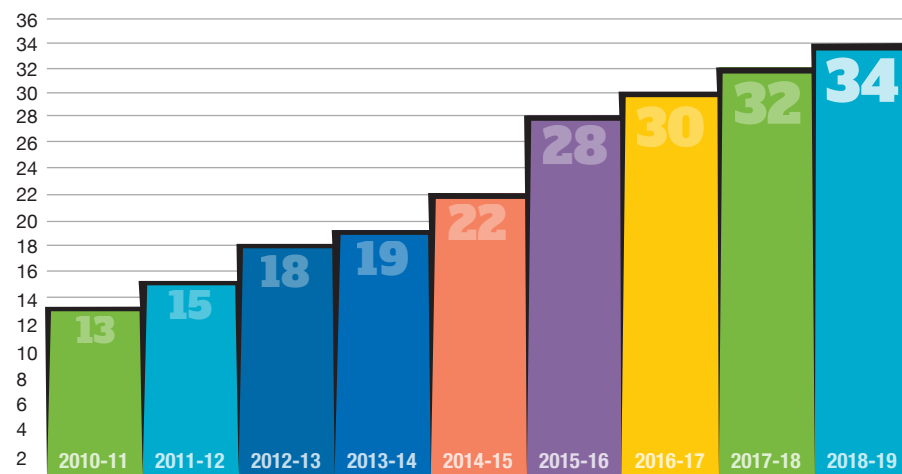
## Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

In 2018, nearly 300 seniors from OCM BOCES' component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including Cazenovia students William Moskvich, Devin Shon, Michael Stanton and Nathaniel Tainter.

## OCM BOCES & Cazenovia = Student Success



Gabe Flanders has only worked in the OCM BOCES Automotive Technology program at Driver's Village in Cicero for a few months, but he already loves it. That's because the 17-year-old junior from Cazenovia has tinkered with cars for more than half his life, helping his father and grandfather work on all kinds of vehicles at a garage they owned and operated in Vermont.

"I loved it — I loved the atmosphere," he recalled.

Gabe was especially motivated to apply for the program because he admired the accomplishments of one of his upperclassmen in Cazenovia, Devin Shon, who completed the OCM BOCES Automotive Technology program in 2018 and is now attending SUNY Morrisville. Gabe hopes to

follow in Devin's footsteps, including the pursuit of an internship or job with Chevrolet, his favorite brand of car.

Gabe's instructor, Erick Dodge, says his student has plenty of enthusiasm for the hard work ahead. He is currently teaching the class about the importance of following procedures and operations, as well as the professionalism required to intern at Driver's Village dealership. So far, Gabe says he understands the importance of learning step-by-step procedures for a repair, including "the need to know when to do it, how to do it, and why to do it."

He is thankful for the opportunity and hopes others with a love for cars will give it a try, even if they are hesitant. "This program has been extremely helpful to me, to learn how this profession works and how to interact with the people in it," he said. "It also teaches me unique, priceless skills that traditional schooling wouldn't normally teach."

## Did You Know?

Several Cazenovia educators attended, "Before the FBA: Using Function Based Problem Solving within a Multi-tiered System of Support." Function-Based Problem Solving is a continuum-based, systematic approach to create effective Tier 2 behavioral interventions. Essential components include gathering data, identifying patterns, determining the function of the behavior, selecting an intervention, and monitoring progress. Participants from Cazenovia discussed conditions that might be contributing to problematic student behavior. They also demonstrated an understanding of how data informs decision-making and learned how to develop informal behavior support plans.
