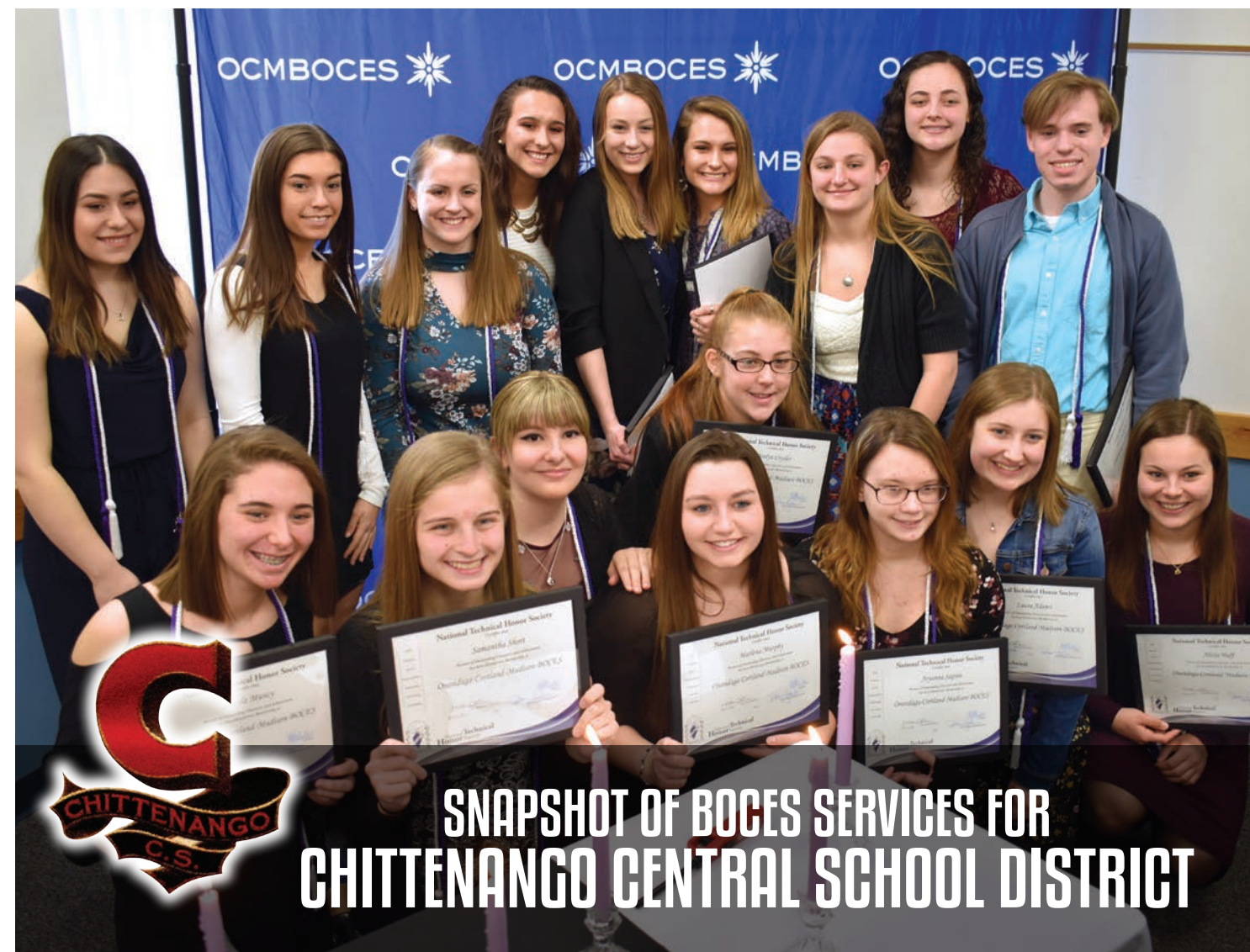

Chittenango's share of the 2018-19 BOCES administrative budget **\$72,535**

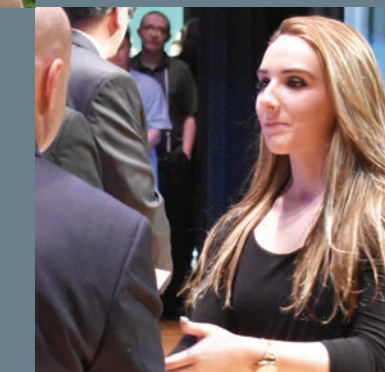


Through cooperative purchasing, in 2017-18 Chittenango saved an estimated **\$102,223**

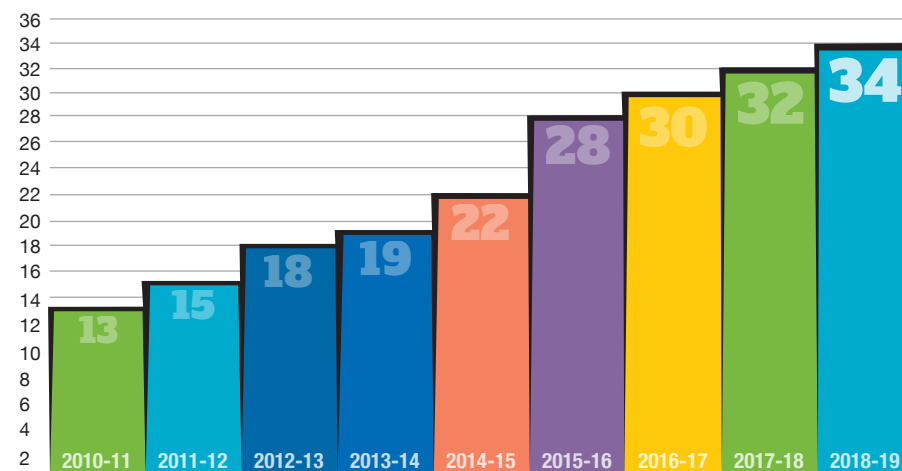
## Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

In 2018, nearly 300 seniors from OCM BOCES' component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including Chittenango students Brittany Adams, Nolan Allen, Baylie Bertella, Kiera Bertella, Kaylei Brownell, Skyler Burns, Alazea Darrow, Kaylee Howard, Macayla Irwin, Cynthia Leonard, Shayla Muncy, Brianna Paikin, Travis Perrigo and Gavin Wandersee.

## OCM BOCES & Chittenango = Student Success



Samantha Kinney is a senior from Chittenango who plans to study biology at SUNY Potsdam because science, as she puts it, "is the basis for everything." Still, she is leaving her career options open for a relatively new passion — criminal justice — because of a positive and transformative experience this year in the OCM BOCES New Vision Criminal Justice program at the Onondaga County Sheriff's Department.

Above all, the program has boosted her confidence. "I have always been quiet in school," she explained. "But since I've been in the New Vision Criminal Justice Program, I have come out of my shell. I am learning to become more prepared for college."

Her guidance counselor, Melissa Weigelt, said Samantha worked hard to be admitted to the New Vision program, which is taught as a college-level course. The result has been a "perfect fit," Weigelt said.

Her New Vision teacher, Charles Wilson, says Samantha is thriving. She's in the top 10% of her class academically. Her enthusiasm and positive attitude are apparent. "Samantha is an energetic young adult," he said. "Her work ethic and overall drive are unparalleled. She is destined to be a future mover and shaker."

The program's teaching assistant, Denise Mecca, says Samantha recently worked hard and went the extra mile to get some donations for a field trip in May to Washington, D.C. The class can now enjoy a free dinner during their first night in the capital for National Police Week, one of the highlights of the New Vision program.

## Did You Know?

A lesson study team from Chittenango presented a live research lesson at the November 2017 "It's Go Time" Science Conference. The first-grade team helped teachers and administrators from across New York State understand the new New York State Science Learning Standards through a lesson introduction, live research lesson, and lesson debrief. The students and teachers from Chittenango who participated in this lesson demonstrated that all students have the ability to engage in scientific reasoning to build an explanation.
