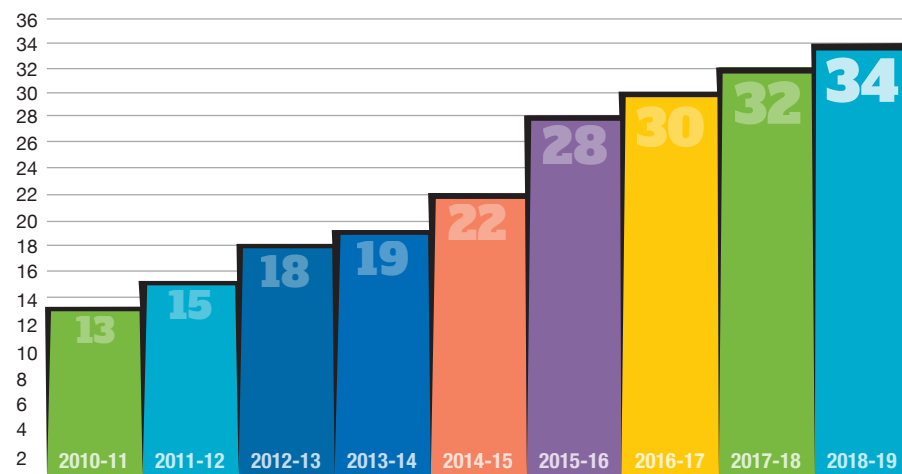
Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

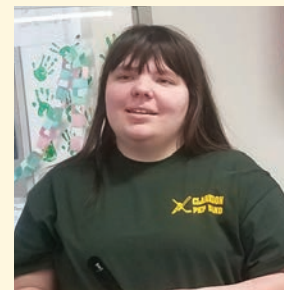
Number of classrooms in school district buildings that host BOCES Special Education Programs

Before she decided to attend Seven Valleys New Tech Academy, Kayla Nielson was terrified of public speaking. Today, after three years of participating in public presentations as part of Project Based Learning, Kayla says she feels “a minor case of nerves,” just enough to keep her on her toes and performing at her best. Last spring, for example, Kayla excelled when she presented her “Passion Project,” a rewritten fairytale, to the entire Seven Valleys community.

“Kayla’s presentation and collaboration skills have grown tremendously,” said one of her facilitators, Shawn Waterman. “During her time here, her true personality has flourished, and she proudly exhibits her identity through her words and actions.”

Kayla also found confidence with one of her greatest loves: writing. At Seven Valleys, the close-knit atmosphere and personalized attention from facilitators have helped her significantly improve her skills. It has also inspired her to write down the stories she only liked to talk about with others. That love of writing has prompted Kayla to pursue a creative writing degree next year at Tompkins Cortland Community College.

“It has been an immense pleasure to work with Kayla over the past three years,” Waterman said. “Her passion for reading and writing inspires and excites everyone she engages with.”

This project extended the work that began last year by allowing teaching teams to engage in their own collaborative inquiry to provide students with integrated deeper learning experiences.
