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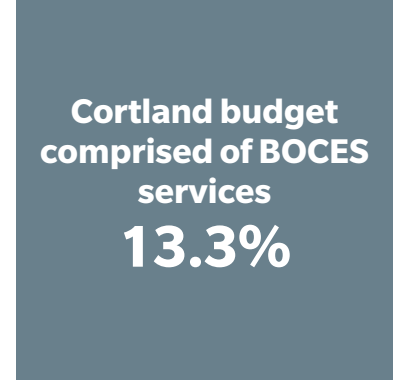

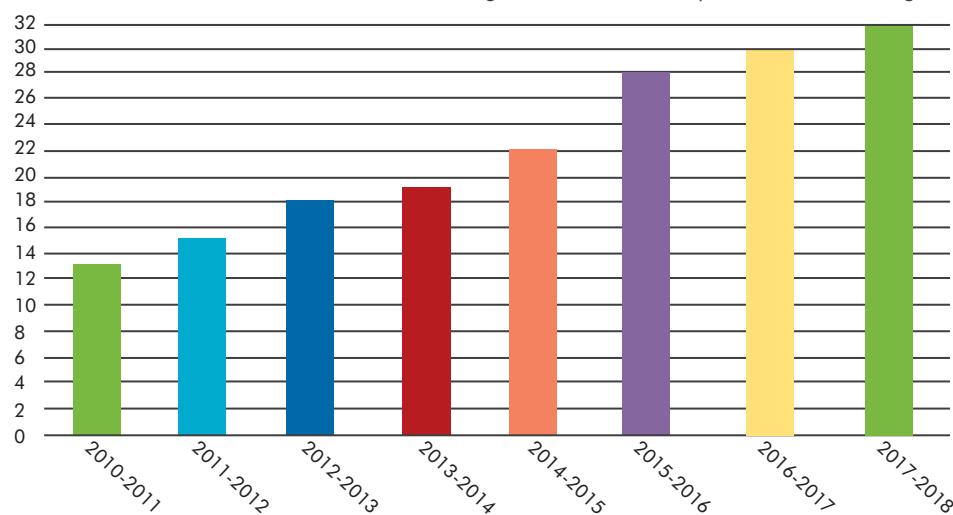
CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of 33 national innovative programs.

In his 1 1/2 years at Seven Valleys New Tech Academy, Nick Ryan of Cortland has grown to appreciate a long list of qualities about the school. He likes the one-to-one technology that allows him to use a laptop for his writing and other classwork. He appreciates the small class sizes. He credits the quality interaction with his facilitators, or teachers, for boosting his grades. He also likes the collaborative work with his peers, a hallmark of the school, which gives him a sense of accomplishment.

Facilitators say Nick, a sophomore, has shown marked improvement in his academic and social skills since he came to Seven Valleys as a freshman. Although he was initially uncomfortable with public speaking, he now feels confident talking to adults in a variety of settings, Principal Joanne Keim said. He has also become skilled at presenting to groups. In terms of agency, or advocating for his own educational needs, Nick has also shown great improvement, Facilitator Maria Gimma said. One of his classmates, Homer sophomore Brady Peck, says Nick is a stellar classmate because he gets his work done, helps others and is always pleasant to be around.

Nick said he especially enjoys being at Seven Valleys because students can shape the culture of their school. "Students have a voice in many aspects of Seven Valleys," he said.

As he looks to the future, Nick says Seven Valleys will prepare him well for college because of the skills and confidence he has gained. It will also give him a head-start earning college credits, with some of his classes offering concurrent enrollment with Tompkins Cortland Community College.

DID YOU KNOW?

Thirteen general and special education co-teaching teams from the Cortland Enlarged City School District attended a two-day professional development session presented by Dr. Marilyn Friend on advanced integrated co-teaching. Teams learned about strategies for ramping up co-teaching models, ways to maximize the effectiveness of planning time, avenues to address accommodations in grading, implementation of Tier 1 instructional design and the integration of specially designed instruction.
