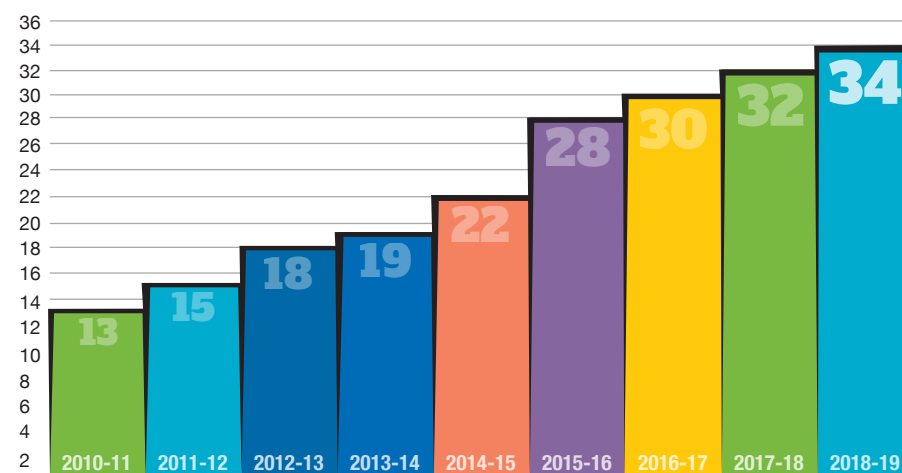
Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

In 2018, nearly 300 seniors from OCM BOCES' component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including East Syracuse Minoa students Kathleen Bayly, Evan Carhart, Samantha Short and Samantha Valentine.

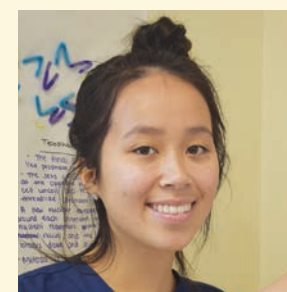
Number of classrooms in school district buildings that host BOCES Special Education Programs

Linda Nguyen is an East Syracuse Minoa senior who is thriving in the OCM BOCES New Vision Medical Professions Program at SUNY Upstate Medical University.

After three months in the program, Linda has taken an interest in pediatrics, orthopedics and cardiology — three of many health-care fields the students observe and learn about in this one-year immersion program. In addition, Linda's participation in the program has allowed her to earn college credits, make friends with students from other districts and affirm her plans to pursue a medical field when she goes to college next year.

Her instructor, Robin Willey, says Linda is a role model for other students.

"Linda hit the ground running when she entered the New Vision Medical Professions Program," Willey said. "In just a short amount of time, she rose to the challenge and embraced the rigorous curriculum. I have a great deal of respect for Linda's intelligence, character and potential."

Linda says the program is fascinating because students not only study health-care fundamentals such as anatomy and physiology, they also discuss challenging and controversial topics in the medical field. "It has pushed me to broaden my horizons and openly look at other points of view," she said.

Willey said Linda is a great fit for the program — and the results are apparent. She is "extremely focused" on her future in the medical field, but also happy to meet other students and build friendships, Willey said.

"Linda's curiosity and compassionate nature contributes to her personal and professional growth," Willey said. "Her quiet demeanor translates to integrity, empathy and maturity."
