

CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION


New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment

and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of 33 national innovative programs.

Number of School District Buildings that host BOCES Special Education Programs





It was a little risky – and a bit scary – for 49 students to give up their familiar high school buildings this fall and embark on a new journey at Seven Valleys New Tech Academy in Cortland, which opened through OCM BOCES.

But Sam Turck, a sophomore from Homer, says the move met all his expectations and more.

"It has opened my horizons," he said. "It has given me skills outside of the classroom. It will get me ready for a college mindset."

If Turck had any reservations about Seven Valleys, they have long disappeared. His social studies facilitator, Kim Wright, says Sam has gained a huge amount of confidence since coming to Seven Valleys and is "extremely engaged in project work," especially those that involve real-world collaborations with businesses and organizations, a hallmark of New Tech schools across the country. Wright said Turck "often takes a leadership role and is always excited to learn."

Turck says students should consider applying for a position in Seven Valleys New Tech Academy even if they are hesitant about leaving their familiar surroundings. He thinks the academic rigor is preparing him well for a future filled with college and, hopefully, law school

"If someone is questioning the idea of coming here," Turck said, "it can completely improve their grades and experience in school."
