


nized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically

Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of 33 national innovative programs.

In 2017, nearly 400 seniors from OCM BOCES' component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including Kiara Brown, Colby Curtis, Janayjah Derby, Jazne Kearse and Alanna Spector from the Jamesville-DeWitt Central School District.

OCM BOCES purchased the **Forecast5** analytics software for all 23 component districts on a trial basis for the next two years. The program collates demographic and peer data for school districts across New York State and allows districts to access that information for the purpose of developing future-focused strategies to manage their limited resources and achieve improving academic success in today's challenging budget environment.

In her quest to become a biomedical engineer, Jamesville-DeWitt senior Scarlette Viefhues recognized the value of enrolling in the state-of-the-art OCM BOCES Laboratory Technology Program at the Thompson Road Campus. There was just one problem: Scarlette often fainted or became light-headed at the sight of blood, and the laboratory tech program included a course on phlebotomy.

"When we first started the phlebotomy course, I couldn't do it," Scarlette said. "Fast forward to one year later, after constantly working at it ... I still get hesitant doing venipunctures and capillary punctures, but now I can do blood typing without cringing."

Despite those challenges, Scarlette says the Career & Technical Education program has proven invaluable to her success because of the knowledge she has gained, the hands-on experience she loves, and the confidence it has fostered by requiring her to work collaboratively with her peers.

"When I first started, I was extremely shy, closed in a shell," she said. "But later on, the group work was not only fun, it helped me open up and become more sociable."

Classmates offer high praise for Scarlette, saying she is enthusiastic, full of humor, willing to help, and a source of motivation to those around her. One classmate described her as a lab-tech "rock star" who "always knows how to get the job done."

Her instructor, Charlene Maciak, said Scarlette has significantly improved her social and academic skills and always seems happy to do a little extra for the class.

"Scarlette is willing and excited to present information in front of the class in an engaging way," Maciak said. "On several occasions, she has volunteered to take on extra projects that involve presenting to the class. In the lab, Scarlette is willing to troubleshoot problems without being discouraged. Her problem-solving skills will no doubt serve her well in the industry."

DID YOU KNOW?

A team of teachers from Jamesville-DeWitt Middle School was selected to deliver a live research lesson at the It's Go Time: Science For All conference. The team engaged in lesson study to plan and enact an 8th grade lesson related to constructing a model to explain the transfer of energy in magnets. The team attended a three-day professional development on lesson study in August and met weekly in September and October to prepare for the live research lesson in front of approximately 60 observers from across New York State. This team represented the district and region as leaders in elementary science education.
