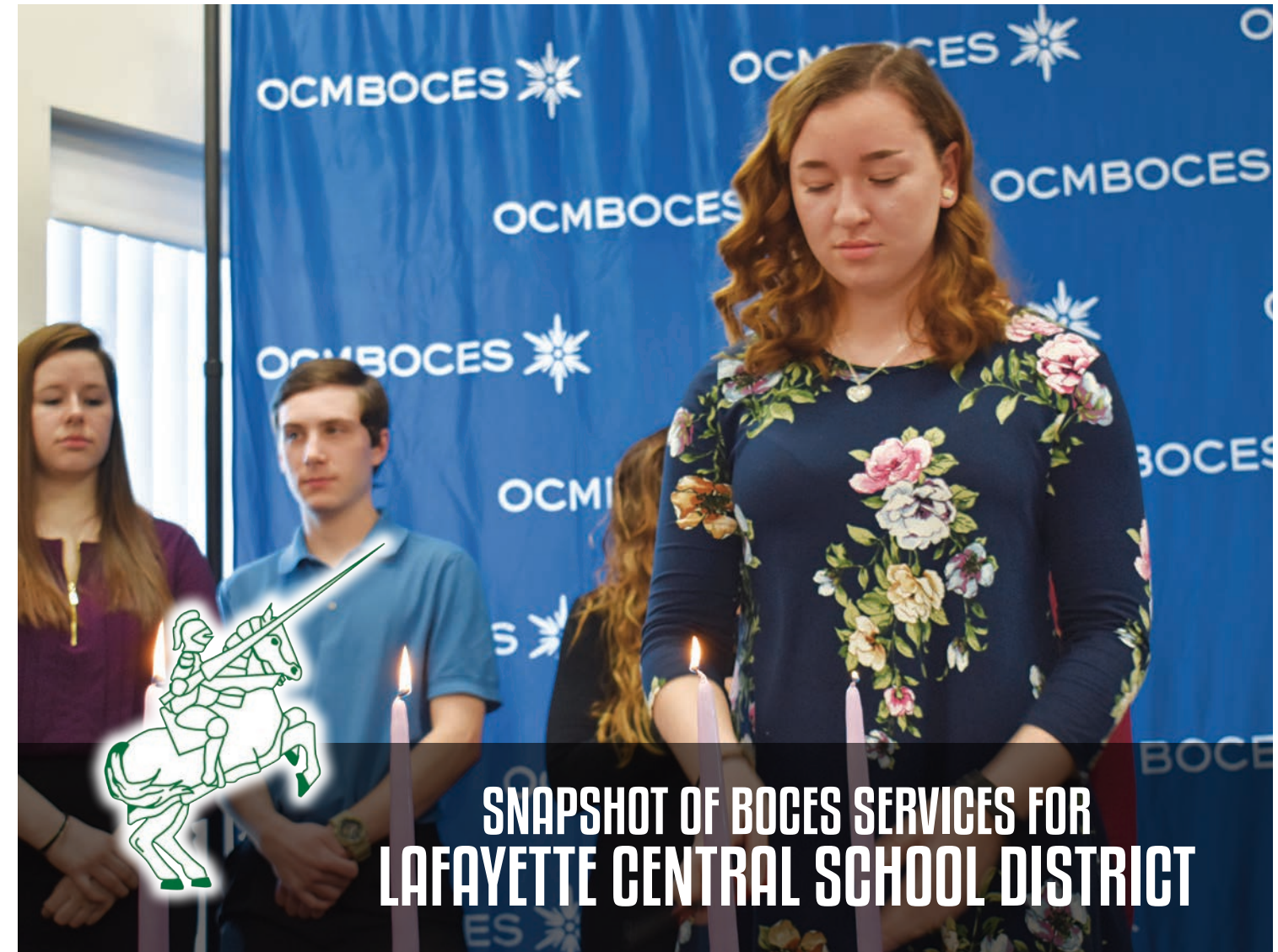

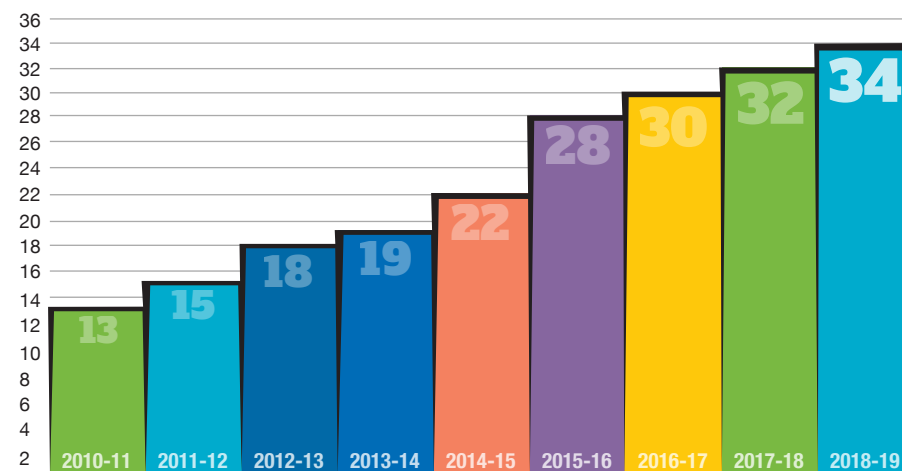
Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

In 2018, nearly 300 seniors from OCM BOCES' component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including LaFayette students Caitlin Campbell, Mackenzie Caron, Riley Jones, Kaitlyn Koons, Andrew Maloney, Keith Robson and Kevin Williams.

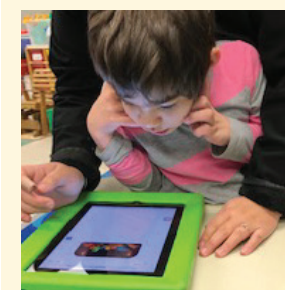
Number of classrooms in school district buildings that host BOCES Special Education Programs

OCM BOCES & LaFayette = Student Success



The impact of the OCM BOCES TEAM Program at Grimshaw Elementary School has been profound for second-grader Sophia Hazeltine, a non-verbal student who now uses a high-tech, speech-generating device to communicate with others and participate in school.

Sophia's mother, Jennifer Hazeltine, says the transformation in her daughter has been astounding. She says the program has "opened up a whole new world" for Sophia, who previously showed little emotion and little interaction with others.

"After Sophia joined the program, a light switch went off in her mind, and I believe her soul," Jennifer said. "We never thought it possible that we would have our daughter stare right into our eyes and smile and demand hugs, but that is our Sophia today. She is funny and sweet and mischievous and so smart. The BOCES program and all of its amazing teachers and therapist have given my child life."

In the classroom, Sophia has made huge gains in the areas of communication, social development, understanding cause-and-effect and paying attention to tasks, said her teacher, Julienne Mayhew. Other staff members talked about Sophia's newfound willingness to climb into a chair for instruction and her ability to use a platform swing on her own.

"Sophia has become a people person," Mayhew said. "She will make great eye contact with an adult and return a smile with a smile. She also gives the best hugs! Sophia first began using real pictures to make a choice for a desired object. Once she mastered that skill, she started using a simple speech-generated device to make simple requests. She is now using a ProSlate communication device, navigating through multiple pages to make requests for desired activities or objects."

Because Sophia has increased her attention to tasks, she can also be integrated into general education classes for all special-area classes and spend time with her typical peers, Mayhew said. Her favorite activities are listening to music on an iPad, technology and movement exercises.

Did You Know?

The Onondaga Nation School began exploring the establishment of the first Native American State Seal of Biliteracy program in New York State. With support from the Mid-State RBERN, the Nation took action to examine and strengthen its Heritage Language program through participation in ACTFL (American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages) professional development. This resulted in the creation of a unit plan used by Dr. Jennifer Eddy of Queens College as an exemplar for all educators of heritage and world languages. The Nation continues to serve as a model by demonstrating strong commitment to preserve its rich culture and language.
