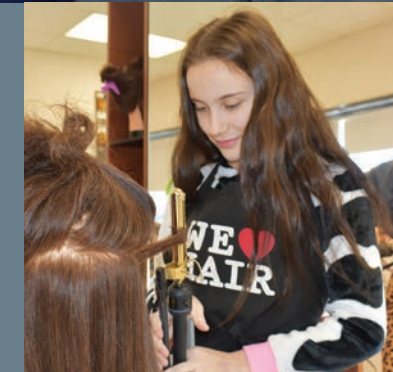

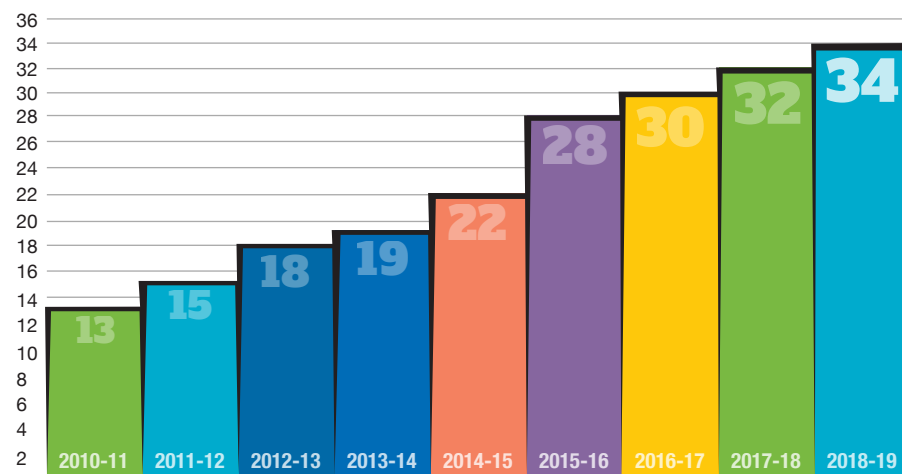
## Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

In 2018, nearly 300 seniors from OCM BOCES' component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including Marathon students Mary Corbo, Morgan Hopkins, Jacob Howard, Ashley Hulbert, Tannery Miner, Zane Potts III, Tamara Schumacher, Bruce Storey, Natalie Thomas and Melodie Wilmarth.

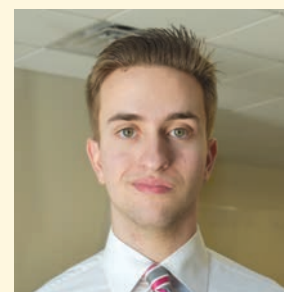
Number of classrooms in school district buildings that host BOCES Special Education Programs

## OCM BOCES & Marathon = Student Success



Daniel Dohanich is a senior at Seven Valleys New Tech Academy who embraces the school's emphasis on self-directed learning, collaboration with peers and employing a "growth mindset" — a belief in one's ability to learn and improve. He also thrives at the school because he likes to delve deep into topics and challenge himself to think in unconventional ways.

Philosophy, for example, is one of his favorite subjects. "I enjoy philosophy because I feel there is no right or wrong answer when presented with a question," he said. "I really have to think outside the box, and I have never been asked to do that before like I have in philosophy."

One of his facilitators, Justin Wood, said Daniel is an ideal student because he likes to "enrich his learning by finding meaning in questions and searching for purpose in the processes used." He also said Daniel "has consistently embraced the challenges he has encountered" in his two years at the school, including his smooth transition into joining a peer group that had already been together for a year.

As for Daniel, he says his favorite aspect of Seven Valleys is "the accountability system," or an emphasis on agency — a feature of Project Based Learning that promotes the ability of students to improve or extend their own learning at their own direction.

Daniel thinks that skill will be essential when he pursues a degree next year in Fire Science at SUNY Broome County Community College. Outside of school, Daniel has already developed a love for firefighting through his volunteer work for the Marathon Volunteer Fire Department. He also participates in band and school plays in his home district. As a result, Daniel has become a well-rounded student with a promising future.

"I enjoy being responsible for my own work and pulling my own weight," he said. "I also like having a voice in what kinds of projects I would like to undertake. Seven Valleys New Tech Academy has helped me become a more proactive student and has made me more confident in my ability to learn."

## Did You Know?

Marathon is continuing the implementation of the new elementary science curriculum materials program aligned to the new New York State Science Learning Standards. Teachers are engaging in two days of just-in-time professional development focused on the standards and the specific unit. The new units were designed by the Smithsonian Science Education Center. The first new units introduced at each grade level focused on real-world, engineering related issues. Fifth-graders, for example, focus on the question, "How do you get water to those in need?" Marathon's Board of Education experienced several lessons from this fifth-grade unit at their fall retreat.
