
nized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District*

Administration magazine as one of 33 national innovative programs.

Number of School District Buildings that host BOCES Special Education Programs





When Megan Lawrence, a sophomore from the Marathon Central School District, decided to become a student at OCM BOCES' Seven Valleys New Tech Academy in Cortland, she says her family members were so proud, they were "practically in tears." They knew the school was the perfect place for Megan to not only grow academically, but also to acquire the skills necessary to be college, career & citizenship ready.

When considering Seven Valleys, Megan knew its focus on Project Based Learning meant she would be engaged in plenty of group work and public speaking.
