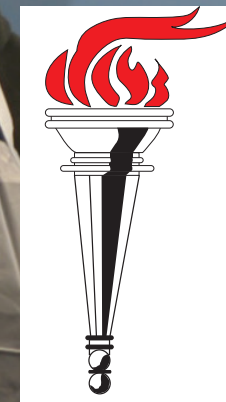

2016-17 SNAPSHOT OF BOCES SERVICES FOR MARATHON CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT

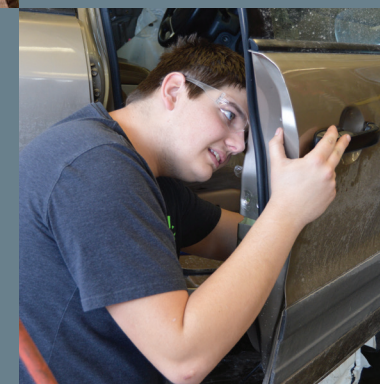

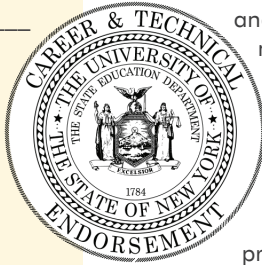

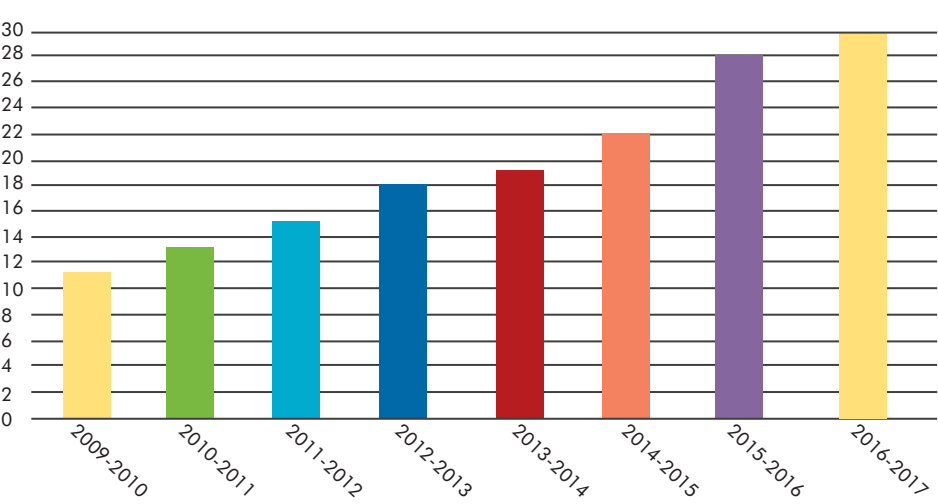
CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

New York State’s approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recog-nized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for indus-try-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of 33 national innovative programs.

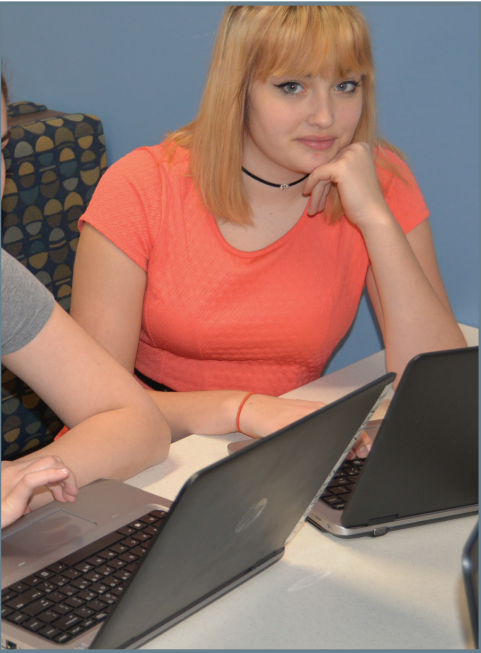

When Megan Lawrence, a sophomore from the Marathon Central School District, decided to become a student at OCM BOCES’ Seven Valleys New Tech Academy in Cortland, she says her family members were so proud, they were “practically in tears.” They knew the school was the perfect place for Megan to not only grow academically, but also to acquire the skills necessary to be college, career & citizenship ready.

When considering Seven Valleys, Megan knew its focus on Project Based Learning meant she would be engaged in plenty of group work and public speaking. Although she was a bit apprehensive about how well she would do in those areas, she now says she has successfully tackled those obstacles because “everyone is so welcoming and there is so much positivity. ... I feel like I can be myself.”

Megan says that until she goes to college, she will continue at Seven Valleys, embracing the hands-on education that is so prevalent at the school. “Here the students are creating lessons and doing hands-on projects on our own while the facilitators oversee,” she says. “It is like we are teaching each other.”

She likes it so much, she thinks other students in her home school should consider it. “I would highly recommend the Project Based Learning environment to anyone that is remotely interested,” she says.
