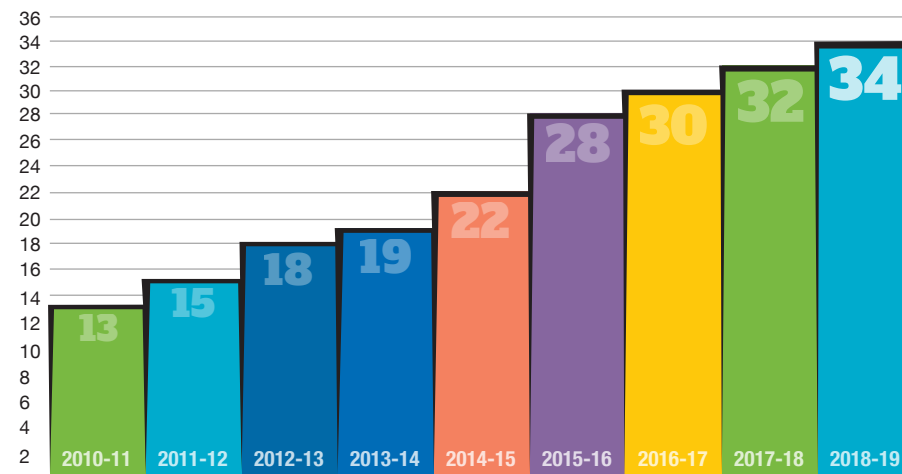
Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

In 2018, nearly 300 seniors from OCM BOCES' component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including Marcellus students Ashley Bealer, Hanna Dellostritto, Kyle Denka, Bridget Fogarty, Kaitlyn Foster, Kate Morris, Courtney Otis, Sydney Spanfelner, Morgan Stevens and Skyler Thorpe.⁷⁸⁴

OCM BOCES & Marcellus = Student Success



Two years ago, Sophia Donalds was determined to pursue a career in physical therapy. This year, all that changed. As a senior at Marcellus High School, Sophia wants to focus on a career in speech and language pathology because she was exposed to it through the OCM BOCES Physical Therapy & Rehabilitative Professions Program. The two-year immersion program is housed at SUNY Upstate Medical University, in the heart of the downtown medical complex. Students are exposed to a variety of medical careers and participate in clinical rotations that include Upstate, Crouse Hospital and the Syracuse VA Medical Center.

The program instructor, Dr. Jennifer Tucker-Locke, says students often change their mind about their career focus after the program exposes them to a variety of medical fields, including prosthetics and orthopedics. In Sophia's case, she took "full advantage of learning about the various career options available to her someday," Tucker-Locke said. "She has always had positive feedback from the healthcare professions she observed."

Sophia says she enjoys the program because it is fun, interesting and hands-on. She also likes the challenge of doing college-level work, including courses such as Anatomy & Physiology that allow her to get a jumpstart on college credits through Onondaga Community College. Tucker-Locke said Sophia has strongly demonstrated the ability to handle those classes.

Sophia agrees.

"I feel like this experience will prepare me for the real world," she said, "and what I learn now will prepare me for college."

Did You Know?

Marcellus continued to focus on innovation by hosting noted author and speaker George Couros through the School Improvement CoSer. Couros is the author of "The Innovator's Mindset" and a self-described consultant on innovative teaching, learning and leadership. To help support the focus on innovation in classrooms throughout the year, Marcellus also contracted for 25 days of customized in-district coaching that focused on innovation and Project Based Learning.
