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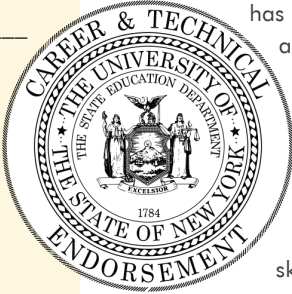

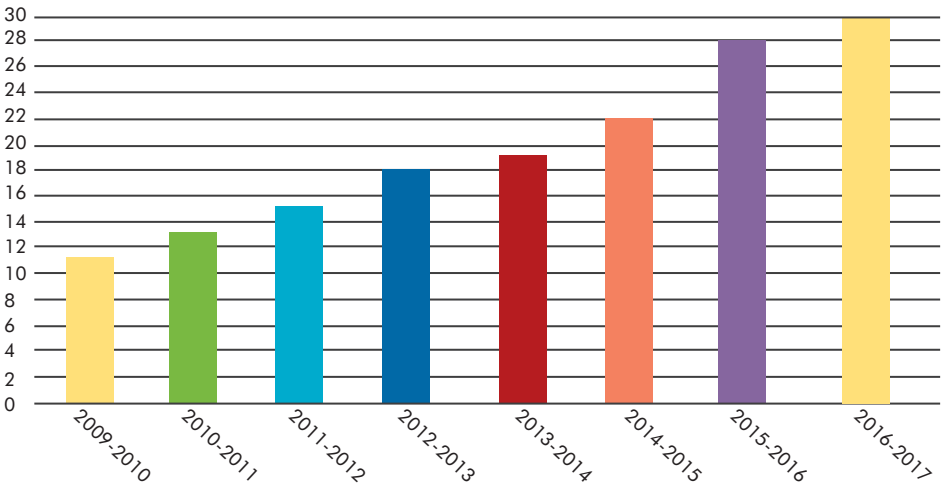
CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

New York State’s approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recog-nized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for indus-try-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed pro-grams, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Adminis-tration* magazine as one of 33 national innovative programs.

In 2016, more than 300 seniors from OCM BOCES’ component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including Marcellus Central School District students: Natalie Bellotti, Jayna Dellostritto, Dakota Elderbroom, Joshua Harris, Alorah McManus (pictured on front cover), Aleksandr Popov, Emily Schmidt and Isabella Wennberg (pictured on front cover).

His teaching assistant, Greg Myers, says specialized curriculum, communication and collaboration have helped Seth the most at OCM BOCES, especially in the area of identifying his own needs.
