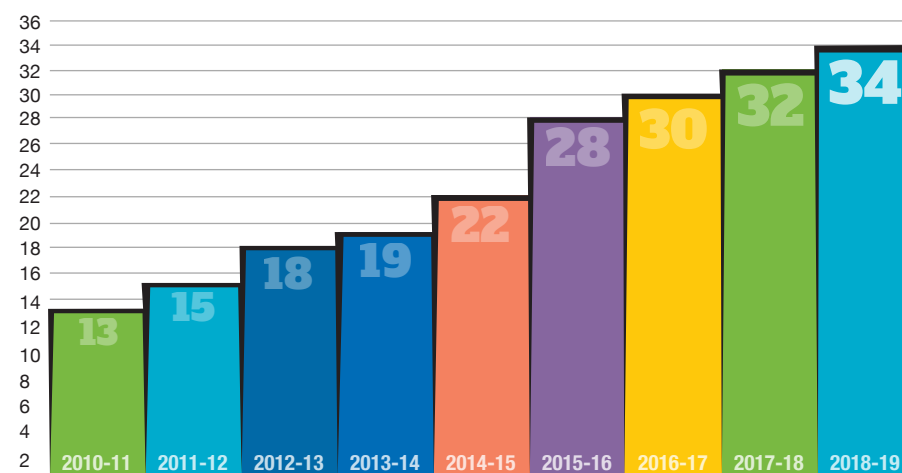
Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

Students at Innovation Tech look up to Amanda Mirarcki, a senior who is now in her fourth year at the New Tech high school in Syracuse. She is comfortable speaking in front of large groups. She works hard to perform well academically. This year, she is mentoring younger students in algebra and participating in the building's Friends of Rachel (FOR) Club, whose goal is to instill a culture of kindness and compassion at the school.

"Amanda has taken on a leadership role in our school community by helping to organize and execute school events," Spanish Facilitator Megan Dudden said. "She is always helpful, reliable and willing to push herself to be better."

School Counselor Kayla Beyer said Amanda's progress has been profound since she joined Innovation Tech as a freshman. The young woman who struggled academically, socially and emotionally in her early days at the school is now confident in herself and comfortable with directing her own learning in the school's small, close-knit educational environment.

"Amanda feels connected and cared for in this type of environment and thankful that she was given the opportunity to come here," Beyer said. "She is someone who provides a lot of hope to underclassmen and is looked up to every day. She brings a light to our halls that does not go unnoticed."

One of Amanda's favorite classes is Career Marketing, which she says has prepared her well for life after high school. She also likes the hands-on, explorative nature of her science classes. Next year, she hopes to continue that work and go to college to pursue a career in marine biology.

That's not surprising to Beyer. "Amanda has a passion and curiosity for the ocean and all the sea life that inhabits it," she said.

Did You Know?

North Syracuse educators participated in a variety of workshops offered by the Regional Special Education Technical Assistance Center that focused on supporting students with disabilities in the realm of behavior and mental health. Several staff members attended a session called, "Supporting Students with Behavioral and Mental Health Challenges," where they explored the manner in which a diagnosis could impact learning in the classroom. Several other staff members attended workshops such as "Classroom Management," "Alternatives to Suspension," and "Function-Based Problem Solving" at the preschool and school-age level.
