CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION


New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary

level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of 33 national innovative programs.

OCM BOCES & NORTH SYRACUSE CSD = STUDENT SUCCESS



Nadia and Isaiah Hudson demonstrate the huge success that is possible each day in the OCM BOCES SKATE program, which stands for Scaffolding Kids' Abilities Through Education. The Hudson siblings, both on the autism spectrum, have flourished in the program because of the strength of its instructional model, its continuity across gradelevel bands and the strong relationships that have developed among their teachers and family members, who often participate in schoolwide activities such as concerts and plays.

Nadia is in the sixth-grade program at Pine Grove Middle School; Isaiah in the fourth-grade program at Split Rock Elementary. Both have participated in the OCM BOCES SKATE program since kindergarten.

"They have truly blossomed," said Annmarie Rossomano, a special education administrator at OCM BOCES. "They have grown academically and socially. They are comfortable in social settings. They have developed confidence in their abilities. They have developed relationships with some of their typical peers."

Danielle Hudson, their mother, has shared her support of the program on panel discussions that focus on its instructional model. Because children with autism often struggle with

transitions, SKATE is specifically designed to provide the right mix of staffing and structure to help students be successful in all settings. Technology, community outings and peer interaction are also tenants of the program.

Rossomano points to the long-term success of the Hudson siblings and says the family "is extremely pleased that the children are able to interact with their typical peers while receiving instruction geared specifically to their needs."
