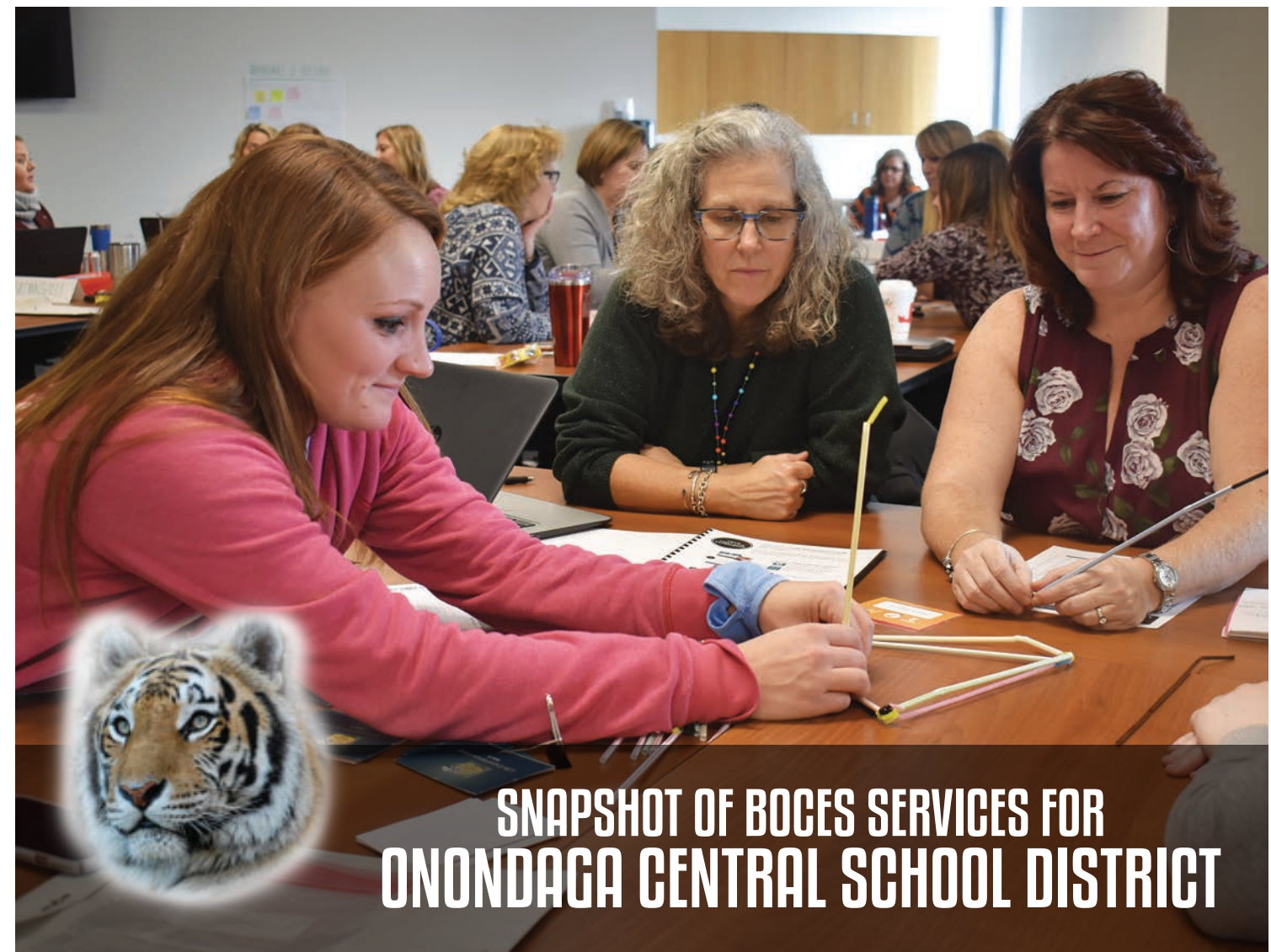

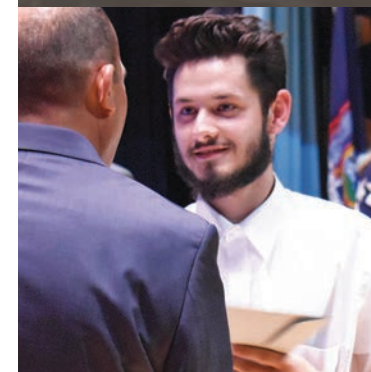

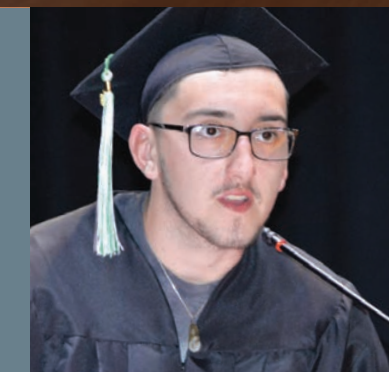

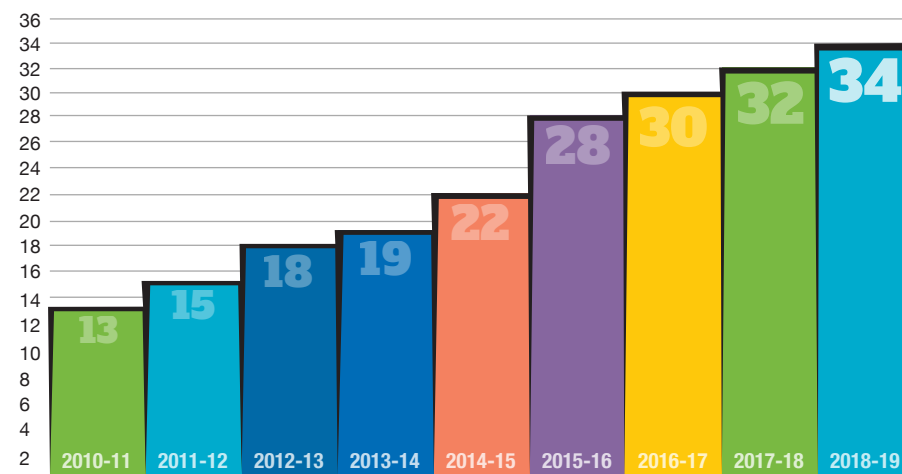
Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

In 2018, nearly 300 seniors from OCM BOCES' component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including Onondaga students Nicholas Hay, Matthew MacMaster, Jr., Nathan Muir and Christina Taylor.

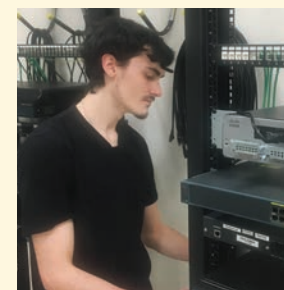
Number of classrooms in school district buildings that host BOCES Special Education Programs

The Computer Technology program at OCM BOCES has been a perfect fit for Thomas Fitzgerald, a senior from Onondaga Central Junior-Senior High School. Thomas is passionate about building computers. He enjoys it as a hobby. He is intent on working in computer technology as a career.

When he first joined the Computer Technology Program last year, as a junior, he was surprised to meet so many students from other Central New York school districts who shared his passion. Above all, he enjoyed the hands-on environment of the program, one that gave him the freedom to learn, explore and challenge himself on a daily basis.

His instructor, Edward Frontuto, says Thomas is excelling academically — both at BOCES and in his home district — and benefitting from a rigorous curriculum that will provide a smooth transition to college-level courses.

"I feel the BOCES program has allowed Thomas to open up socially and form relationships with other like-minded students with similar skills that he would otherwise have never met," Frontuto said. "This program has allowed Thomas to become more engaged in his education."

Next year, Thomas plans to study for two years at Onondaga Community College, then transfer to a four-year college so he can earn his bachelor's degree.

"Thomas is a very responsible student and is taking his education seriously," Frontuto said. "He has an excellent attitude about his career success."

Did You Know?

Onondaga Central Schools experienced a surge in the number of English Language Learners (ELLs) during the 2017-2018 school year. In partnership with the Mid-State Regional Bilingual Education Resource Network at OCM BOCES, the district created professional learning opportunities to expand their knowledge base and add strategies to their toolboxes regarding teaching ELLs. Teachers were able to explore the stages of language acquisition and factors that affect speed and trajectory of that learning as well as specific strategies to address language learning in the classroom at all levels and across content areas.
