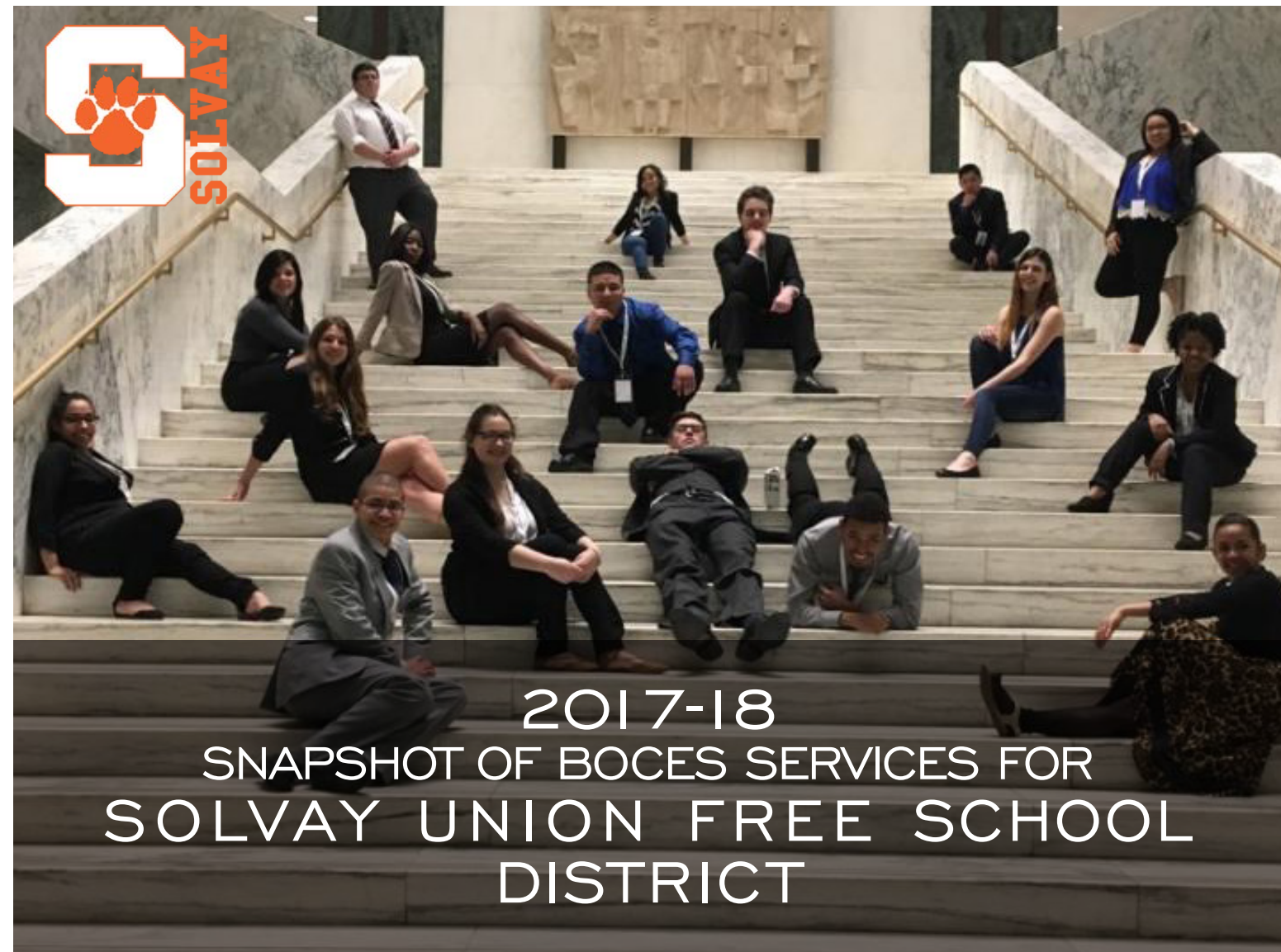

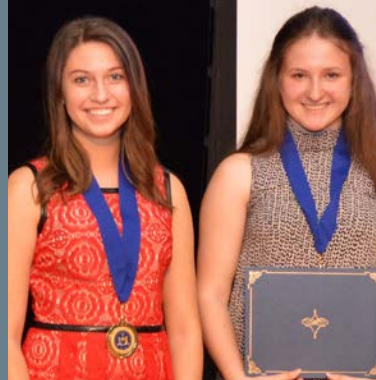


BOCES aid generated to Solvay for 2016-17 services

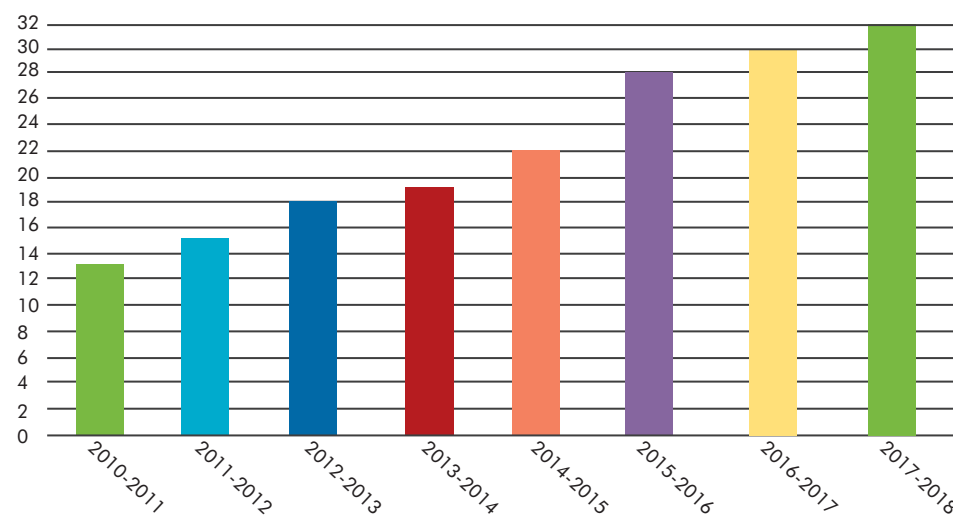
CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of 33 national innovative programs.

In 2017, nearly 400 seniors from OCM BOCES' component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including Celena Bowen, Iveyshionna Ivey (pictured on front cover) and Chelsi Sarno from the Solvay Union Free School District.

OCM BOCES purchased the **Forecast5** analytics software for all 23 component districts on a trial basis for the next two years. The program collates demographic and peer data for school districts across New York State and allows districts to access that information for the purpose of developing future-focused strategies to manage their limited resources and achieve improving academic success in today's challenging budget environment.

As an eighth-grader in the Reach Program at OCM BOCES, Donnell Reid says the individual support from teachers, connections to her peers, Project Based Learning, community service opportunities, and the chance to take on leadership roles have all changed the way she sees herself and her future possibilities. Reach Administrator Emily Behan agrees, saying Donnell has shown tremendous growth in the program.

"Donnell has shown consistent determination at Reach," Behan said. "She continues to challenge herself and build confidence, using her engaging personality to encourage her peers to take responsibility for their actions and be contributing members of the Reach community. Over the past year and a half, we have truly started to see the amazing capabilities Donnell possesses."

Through Reach, Donnell has taken advantage of a number of opportunities made possible through OCM BOCES. This summer, she took part in a two-week pilot program at Orenda Springs, an outdoor education and adventure center in Marcellus. Most recently, Donnell has taken a leadership role in a new "Friends of Rachel" club that began as a result of Rachel's Challenge, an initiative at OCM BOCES to create a culture of kindness and compassion in schools.

Donnell says these opportunities, as well as Reach, have given her a level of confidence and determination she never had before. "I never saw myself as being brave enough to climb up a tree and jump off a platform, and I didn't think I could be a leader," she said. "Being at Reach, I have learned to trust the teachers and staff. I want to try new things that scared me before."

DID YOU KNOW?

OCM BOCES Mid-State RBERN piloted the first Seal of Biliteracy Consortium in Central New York in partnership with the Solvay Union Free School District and several others during the 2016-17 school year. The pilot served as the framework for a local regional consortium in the OCM BOCES component region in 2017-2018. In June of 2016, six Solvay High School students were honored as the first Seal of Biliteracy recipients.
