





The overarching focus of work from Curriculum, Instruction and Assessment for Tully Central School District is support for literacy achievement by students through instructional work with teachers. Included are several entry points. Denise Pawlewicz continues to develop capacity with a secondary literacy leadership group. Patrick Shaw will work with specific teachers on the use of Project Based Learning as a vehicle to apply literacy skills, as well as, providing coaching on Responsive Classroom to build the culture and climate to enhance literacy achievement.
