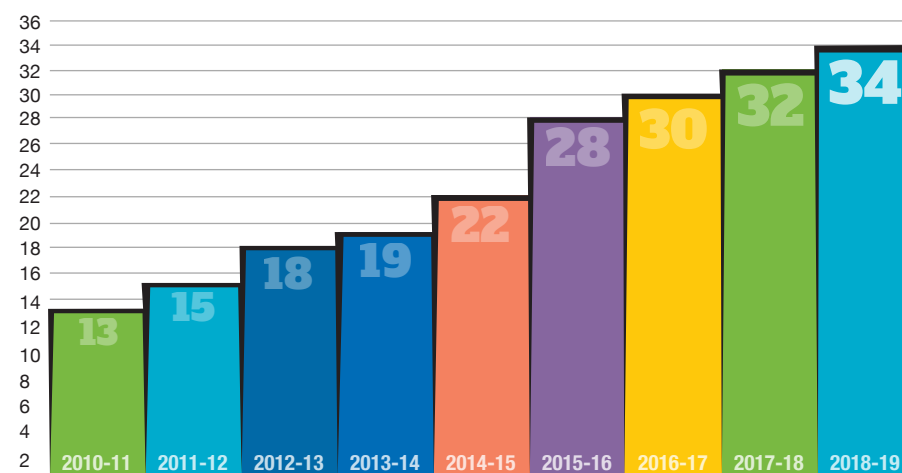
Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

For Tully senior Mackenzie Delles, the OCM BOCES Physical Therapy and Rehabilitative Professions Program has easily become one of her favorite classes. After two years in the program, it has affirmed her desire to pursue a career in the field. It has allowed her to get a jump on earning college credits, giving her a significant academic advantage when she goes to college next fall. Finally, on a personal level, the program has strengthened her overall confidence and fueled her determination to be successful in a competitive field.

"Mackenzie has developed great study skills and an excellent knowledge base in our program, which will certainly help her in her future studies," said her instructor, Christine Bosco. "By taking college courses, she has shown the self-motivation she needs to excel at the next level, along with developing time-management skills."

Mackenzie has been mastering college-level work in the Physical Therapy program while balancing a busy class schedule at Tully High School and participating in extracurricular activities, including track and field, where she specializes in pole vault.

One of the physical therapists Mackenzie observed and worked with in the program was Pam Downey at Tully Elementary School. Downey said Mackenzie "consistently demonstrated a genuine interest in physical therapy with children" and had a "friendly and outgoing nature around pediatric clients" that made her stand out.

Mackenzie says she especially appreciates the PT program because the classes, such as Medical Terminology and Anatomy & Physiology, have been challenging and relevant. She likes the small class size and individualized attention from her instructor, which makes it easier for her to learn. Above all, she looks forward to spending time with classmates who share her passion.

"My favorite thing about BOCES has to be all the new friends I have made in the last two years," she said. "I have become very close to quite a few people in this class, and seeing them every day for two hours is something I always look forward to."
