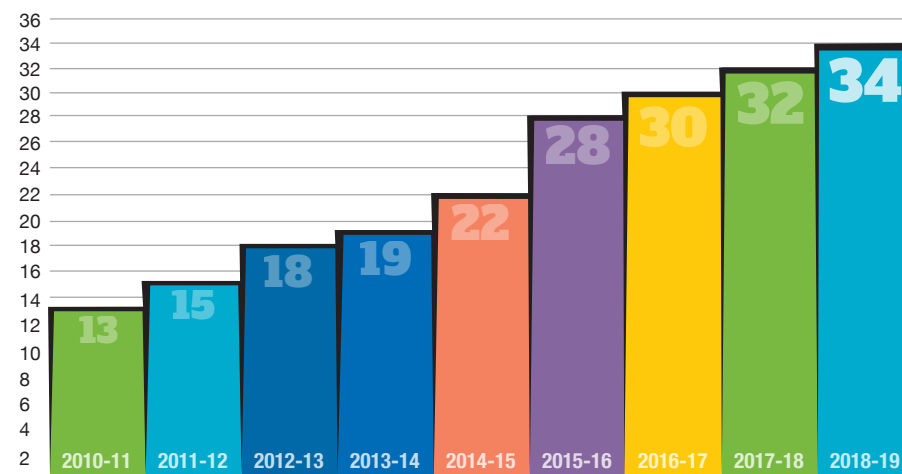
Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

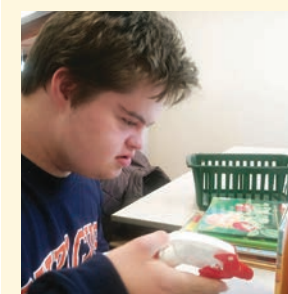
Number of classrooms in school district buildings that host BOCES Special Education Programs

For Brian Powers, the bustling campus of Onondaga Community College has been his school and workplace for the past two years. Brian is part of the OCM BOCES Transitions program, which offers on-site classrooms and workplace opportunities at OCC and SUNY Cortland for post-high school students. Brian's favorite part of the program is working in an OCC library, where he cleans and organizes books. He also enjoys Community Hab, where mentors take OCM BOCES students into the community for activities such as bowling, movies, and volunteer work.

Brian's instructor, Luke Tatusko, said Brian has benefited greatly from attending BOCES programs, including the TEAM program he attended before going to OCC.

"BOCES has provided Brian with classroom, community and vocational experiences that have met his needs and encouraged his success," Tatusko said. "These experiences have helped Brian interact with his world and peers, and have helped him develop a better understanding of what he wants out of it."

The goal of the Transitions Program is to give Brian tools and experiences to choose what he wants to do in the future and advocate for himself. Wherever he lands, people will enjoy his friendly and good-hearted nature, Tatusko said.

"Brian is a kind-hearted young man who has shown that all students have the ability to be successful, not only in the classroom but in their community as well," Tatusko said.
