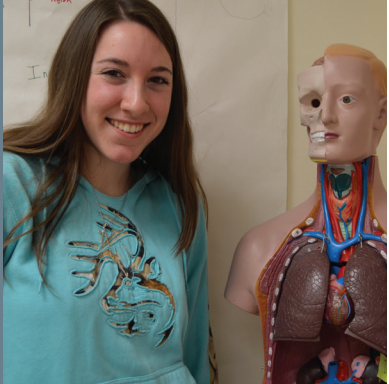

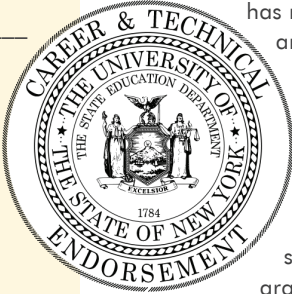

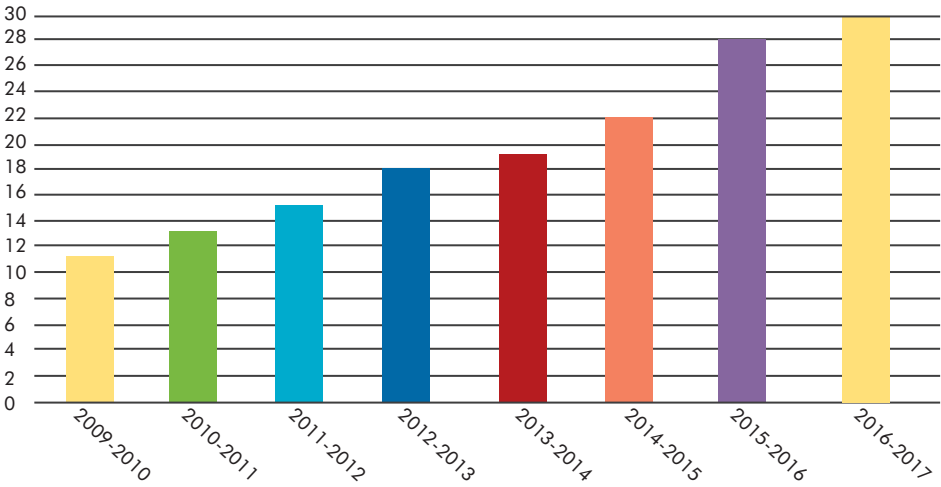
CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

New York State’s approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of 33 national innovative programs.

Ask Kiera Bertella to speak one word that relates to her education, hobby, and future plans, and the Chittenango High School junior would probably say, “hippotherapy.” She might then offer the specialized term’s textbook definition: The use of horseback riding as a therapeutic or rehabilitative treatment, especially as a means of improving disabled individuals’ coordination, balance, and strength.

Kiera has long enjoyed competitive horseback riding. The 17 year old also has a passion to help people who have neurological disorders and physical challenges. That’s why she chose to include OCM BOCES’ Physical Therapy Professions course in her high school career. The class meets on the SUNY Upstate medical campus, and her teacher, Dr. Jennifer Tucker-Locke, says Kiera is extremely hard-working, and a “rock star” of a P-T student who comes to class and its clinical-rounds eager to learn and smiling every day.

“Kiera always has something good to say to everyone,” notes Dr. Tucker-Locke, “and her study skills, curiosity, and drive to put knowledge into practice, really define what a great Career & Technical Education student is all about.”

DID YOU KNOW?

Chittenango has 4 ADA-PEP counselors serving elementary and high school students. Deb Peterson Smith at Bridgeport Elementary developed an interest/career inventory for her students to help recognize growth patterns as students progress through the grades. Fill in the blank questions for kindergarten students include: “When I grow up I want to be...” and “When I’m not in school I like to...”. By 4th grade, the sentence completions look a little different: “My goal for this school year is...”, “I am involved in the following activities or clubs...” and “The career I think I would like to have as an adult is...”.

Through Chittenango’s SADD (Students Against Destructive Decisions) group, the high school ADA-PEP counselor provides leadership activities such as a mock DWI crash and assemblies emphasizing avoiding drugs and choosing positive activities, that encourage students to make decisions that will benefit them in life.
