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

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

Cincinnati budget comprised of BOCES services 17.9%




Cincinnati share of BOCES Administrative Budget \$18,790


CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of 33 national innovative programs.

In 2016, more than 300 seniors from OCM BOCES' component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including Keyara Aiken, Kristen Angell, Ashley Angell, Averi Hull, Jennifer Ivison, Jarith Karr, Terry Petty, Amber Price, Brooke Tobias, Brody Wehner and SerenaRa Witty from the Cincinnatus Central School District.



Cincinnatus School District is working with the Special Education School Improvement Specialist (SE-SIS) to establish a new system that will help teachers implement Individualized Education Program (IEP) progress monitoring with fidelity. The SE-SIS is providing ongoing coaching to individual teachers as they use student assessment data to determine best instructional practices and interventions necessary to meet their student's needs. By using explicit and direct instruction, specially designed instruction, and differentiated instruction in a variety of settings, the student with special needs can better meet state standards and incur educational benefit.
