

SED Update October 2015

Assessment

Schools are now volunteering (or not) to try a stand-alone 3-8 ELA or math field test in a computer-based format. At this point, approximately 20% of schools have expressed a willingness to try a computer-based format. By the end of the new test-development contract with Questar (new vendor), the actual assessments will be available (but not required) in a computer-based format.

Computer based practice tests will be available for everyone to use - if they wish - by January. The practice tests will allow people to see how the embedded math tools work and try them out.

There are no immediate plans for computer-based Regents examinations. The problem is that SED does not have the money to make the transition. At this point, there is not much of a public outcry for computer-based Regents testing, yet. If the 3-8 experience is positive then this might change.

Dynamic Learning Map Program (DLM) is the new NYSAA vendor for ELA & math. It is an online assessment program but it is not a big technology burden because the test is administered individually to students. The window for the ELA & math testing will be March to the beginning of June. The vendor scores the tests so this relieves schools of the scoring responsibility. These are the "Essential Elements" of the new format and here are some sample items. Science and social studies will remain unchanged in the NYSAA, with a window that starts at the beginning of January and goes through mid-February.

Standards

A "Standards Survey" is due out from SED. They want to collect feedback from the field about the standards and their implementation. Subsequently, a standards review team will take a look at the feedback. The <u>survey</u> will be open from October 21st until November 30th.

More **social studies** inquiries continue to be posted to the <u>c3 teachers.org</u> site. A video about the Social Studies Toolkit should be available soon (and posted to the c3 site).

The release of the draft of new **science standards** might be delayed because of the standards survey. Or, at least the feedback gathering might be delayed as SED tried to avoid two surveys going on at once.

APPR

The <u>assessment RFQ</u> is up and assessments are being reviewed on a rolling basis. Assessments that can be used for the student performance/SLO portion have been approved. Districts are having success submitting their own assessments (<u>see list</u>). STAR is also on the list. No assessments have been approved as supplemental measures, yet.
