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OCM BOCES plans development of New Tech School



One of the goals OCM BOCES has established for the 2013-14 school year involves the research and planning necessary to create its own New Tech school in September 2014.

In working toward this goal, BOCES has been meeting with superintendents and learning from successful models. On October 24, 2013, OCM educators joined together with two central New York lawmakers to tour Tech Valley High School[®] in Rensselaer New York.

Superintendent Jody Manning, Assistant Superintendent Colleen Viggiano and Career Academy Principal Pat Mahunik accompanied Assemblymen

Samuel Roberts and Al Stirpe, and representatives from TC3 to the school looking for ideas in creating a New Tech School which uses the elements of the Tech Valley High School and New Tech Network models.

The group was led on a tour of the school by sophomore Nafisa Rahman and junior Ben Johnson. Under their leadership, the group learned how TVHS students work online, prepare presentations for large groups of adults and peers, and participate collaboratively on nearly every part of their heavily project-based education experience. The educators also visited a class where they asked freshmen students and their teacher questions.

"At Tech Valley, we witnessed firsthand how relevant instruction creates enthusiasm in students as they work together in project-based learning experiences. It is exciting to think about bringing this to our area," said Manning.

The educators and elected officials also met with a panel of TVHS experts, including Questar III District Superintendent James N. Baldwin and Capital Region BOCES' Lynne Wells, and took part in a question-and-answer session with faculty.

"It is always a pleasure to be able to share the TVHS model and the successes we have had with educators and education supporters who are clearly looking to improve the education delivery model," said TVHS Principal Dan Liebert.
