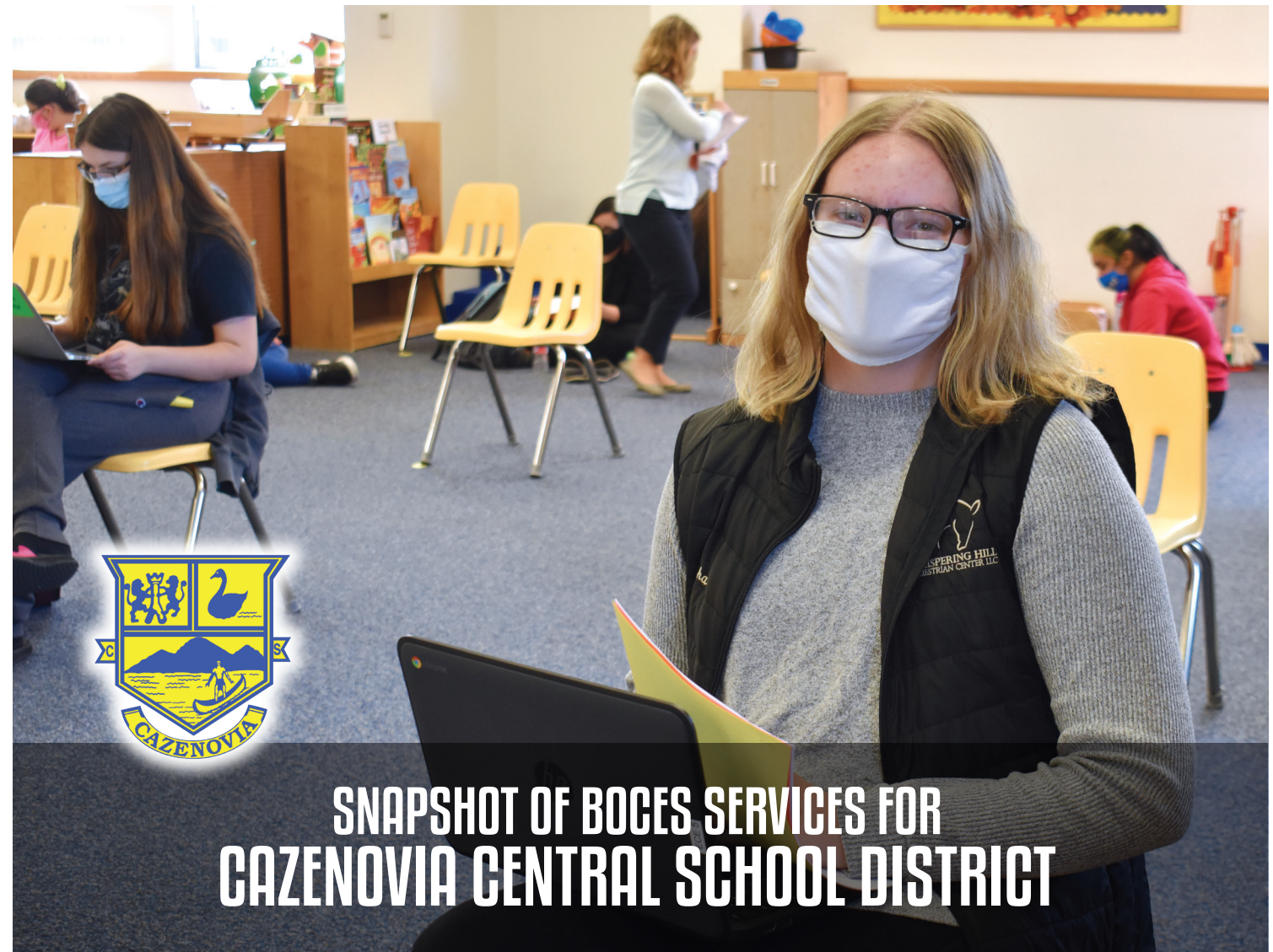

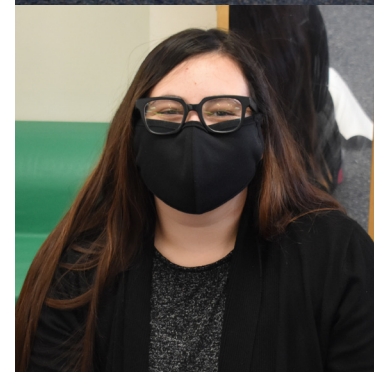

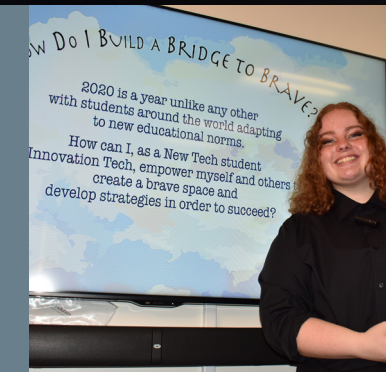

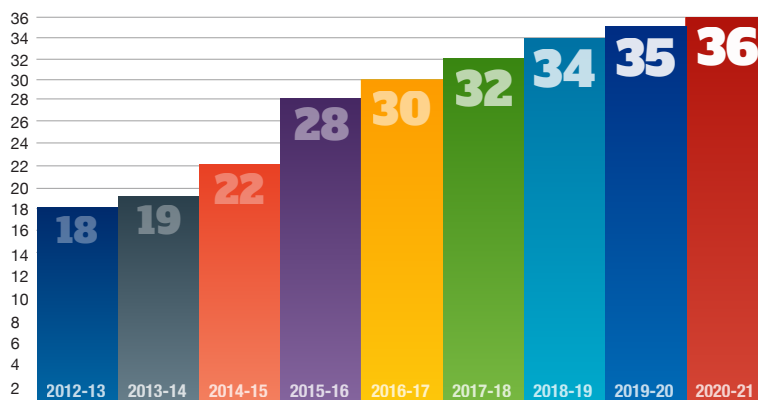
Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

In 2020, 441 seniors from OCM BOCES' component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including Cazenovia students Gabriel Flanders, Mikaylee Smith, Anthony Vazquez, and Ryan Wheeler.

OCM BOCES & Cazenovia = Student Success



Jesse Wood spent much of his childhood tinkering with cars, four-wheelers, and dirt bikes — pretty much anything on wheels that needed a few repairs. That's why the junior from Cazenovia explored all sorts of Career & Technical Education options at OCM BOCES when he spoke with his school counselor and visited the Thompson Road Campus last year. Wood was considering two programs in particular — automotive technology and automotive collision — when his interest switched to a new, business-embedded program at Tracey Road Equipment in East Syracuse.

"I just wanted to give it a try," he said. "I know this class is just getting off the ground, but there's so much potential here."

This two-year program, called Heavy Equipment, Repair and Diesel Technology, allows students to have a dedicated classroom space at Tracey Road, as well as access to a huge work bay that now holds a decommissioned semi-truck for plenty of hands-on experience. On a recent day, students worked in teams to disassemble a pair of Caterpillar C2.2 diesel engines and identify parts while following a schematic.

Wood said the program makes him excited about going to school, mostly because he prefers being on his feet and moving around, rather than sitting at a desk or working out of a textbook. Outside of school, he has an active schedule that includes working at the Brewster Inn and serving as a volunteer firefighter.

Looking ahead, Wood hopes to learn as much as possible at OCM BOCES over the next two years and someday work for Tracey Road. The company partnered with OCM BOCES largely because it wanted to help local students, generate interest in the field, and offer the kind of technical, skilled training that will help them hire future employees from Central New York.

"My whole family likes the idea of me coming here," Wood said. "It's not just schooling, it's a program that's leading me on a career path. Everywhere in the country, there's a need for mechanics."

Did You Know?

Members of Cazenovia's Board of Education and Superintendent Matt Reilly participated in training on the New York State Council of School Superintendents' (NYSCOSS) rubric for superintendent evaluations. Last year, Cazenovia implemented SuperEval. The board was trained in the six different domains that encompass the work of a superintendent. This process enhances the performance of the superintendent and helps sustain a healthy relationship between the board and the superintendent.
