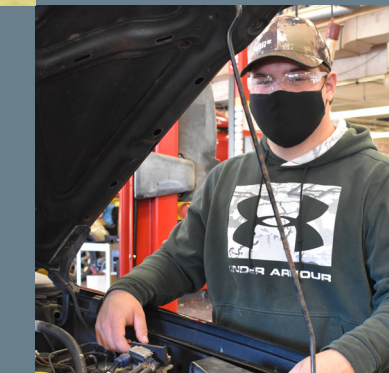

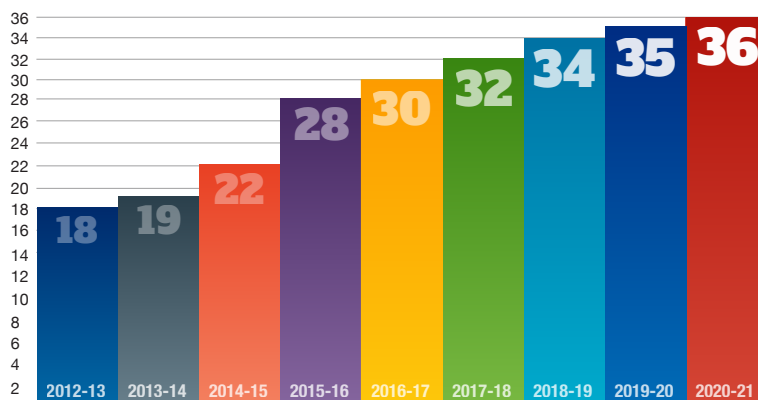
Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

In 2020, 441 seniors from OCM BOCES' component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including Fabius-Pompey students Lacey Bigtree-Deziley, Tatiana Compton, Alyssa Golden, Rayn Hurlbert, and Annika Wertz.

OCM BOCES & Fabius-Pompey = Student Success



Tanner Belge has made huge strides in the OCM BOCES LaFayette Transition Program — just ask his mother.

Mornings have become peaceful because Tanner, an 11th-grader, loves to go to school. In the evenings, he takes it upon himself to “do any additional schoolwork at home, on his own, whereas before he would resist,” she said. In the two years he has attended this program, she added, “our family has changed for the positive, and our whole day is different. With smaller class sizes and better grades, Tanner feels totally different about himself — he feels like he is part of something!”

Tanner agrees with his mom. The LaFayette Transition Program, which he has attended for a little more than two years, has helped him make significant progress.

“I feel like I fit in,” he said. “I now have friends who respect me and have similar challenges. I feel like, because the academics are slowed down, I can understand them, and because there are less people in the class, it makes me feel like my education is more individualized. Coming to this program, with all the positive reinforcement I receive, has helped me excel.”

Tanner has also evolved from being a reserved and quiet student, mostly working by himself, to the talkative “social leader of his crew,” with classmates looking up to him as a role model for how to treat others, said Jeffrey Gabriel, a school social worker.

He also shows an increased focus on his work and a willingness to accept feedback, which has significantly improved his writing skills, said his teacher, John Scharmach.

“I see Tanner applying himself more and more academically,” he said. “Tanner always has a positive attitude and works hard to make himself better.”

Did You Know?

During winter break in February, the OCM BOCES School Library System (SLS) worked with school librarians across the region to encourage the use of Sora and increase the number of eBooks read by students. Working as partners, SLS and Sora's parent company, OverDrive, created a challenge to recognize the district with the biggest increase in the number of eBooks borrowed and read by students. Fabius-Pompey won this challenge hands-down due to the incredible advocacy of two school librarians, Melissa Porter and Heather Turner.
