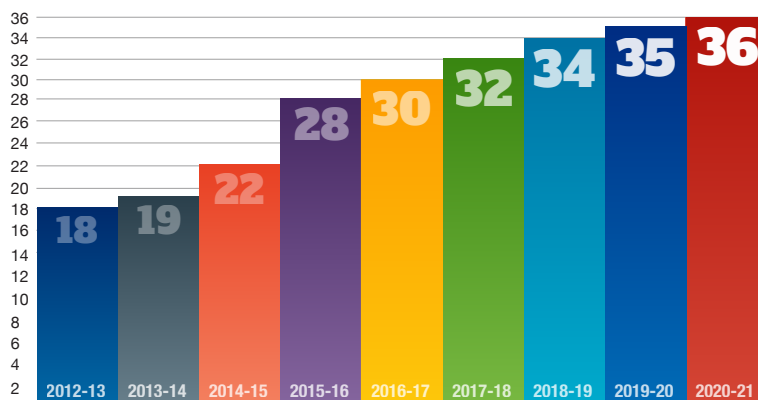
## Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

In 2020, 441 seniors from OCM BOCES' component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including Jamesville-DeWitt students Whitewolf Afraid Of Bear, Kaeleigh Baum, Alyssa Demmon, Madollyn Dobrovech, Dylan Drury, Xavier Grant, Zachary Jerome, Sabastion Lauckarn, Jacob Melick, Savannah Scerbo, Caman VanStry, and Melissa West.

Logan Walrath has made great progress in advancing his social skills and coping skills since entering the OCM BOCES Strides K-6 program at the Crown Road Campus more than two years ago. Logan, a fifth-grader from Jamesville-DeWitt, has thrived in these areas and more because of the program's individualized instruction and small-class setting.

"Logan performs grade-level tasks with ease and enjoys learning about new topics and strategies," said his teacher, Lizzy Gillette. "He has improved his social-emotional skills and is highly engaged during group counseling and social skills groups."

These connections and lessons have helped Logan in ways he can notice. Since entering BOCES, Logan reports that he is much better at controlling his emotions and behaviors, getting less frustrated with his tasks. He especially enjoys getting to know his classmates, interacting with staff, doing hands-on work and learning about science, his favorite subject.

In this small-class environment, Logan's teachers and classmates say Logan shines. They describe him as a kind, sensitive, team-oriented student who is very interested in current events and feels strongly about inclusiveness and the Black Lives Matter movement.

"Logan is a special part of our classroom family," Gillette said. "He is an excellent role model for other students and a pleasure to have in large- and small-group instruction."

Jamesville-DeWitt educators began the journey to becoming culturally responsive educators by utilizing their membership in the OCM BOCES School Improvement CoSer to finance a contract with Culturally Responsive-Sustainable Education (CR-SE) experts from the New York University Metro Center.
