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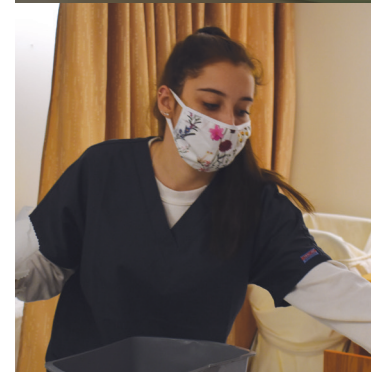

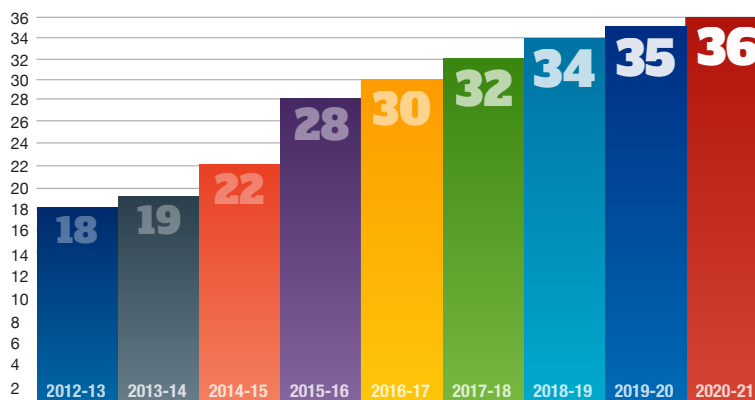
Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

As a senior at the STARS Alternative High School, Logan Buchanan stands out as a model student. He attributes his success to the smaller class sizes at STARS and the abundance of support he receives from teachers, social workers, other staff members, and the principal.

Logan came into the program three years ago with credit deficiencies, but with his determination and support from his school counselors and administrators, he is back on track academically.

For Logan, STARS has made all the difference in his life.

"The staff really tries to build relationships with students and really encourage them," he said. "I was glad to be able to take the necessary credits, get higher grades and graduate with my class. STARS helped me to be happier at school, more successful academically, and achieve my goals."

Looking ahead, Logan hopes to pursue a career in real estate, an idea he discovered in a career exploration class at STARS and affirmed in a financial planning class.

Emily Behan, the assistant director of the program, is proud. She says Logan "has matured into a responsible, respectful and caring member of our school community. He is a member of the Friends of Rachel (FOR) Club, has participated in community service opportunities, and has set and accomplished clear goals for his future. Logan embodies the spirit of STARS in his demeanor, his motivation and his determination to succeed."

Did You Know?

The Liverpool Central School District participated in a regional training by Futures Education and moved forward with a School Improvement Project to conduct a Special Education review process. The process included confidential interviews, visits to every building, and evaluations and analysis of organizational structures, workloads, and student classification data. Audits like these can help districts maximize their resources for educating students.
