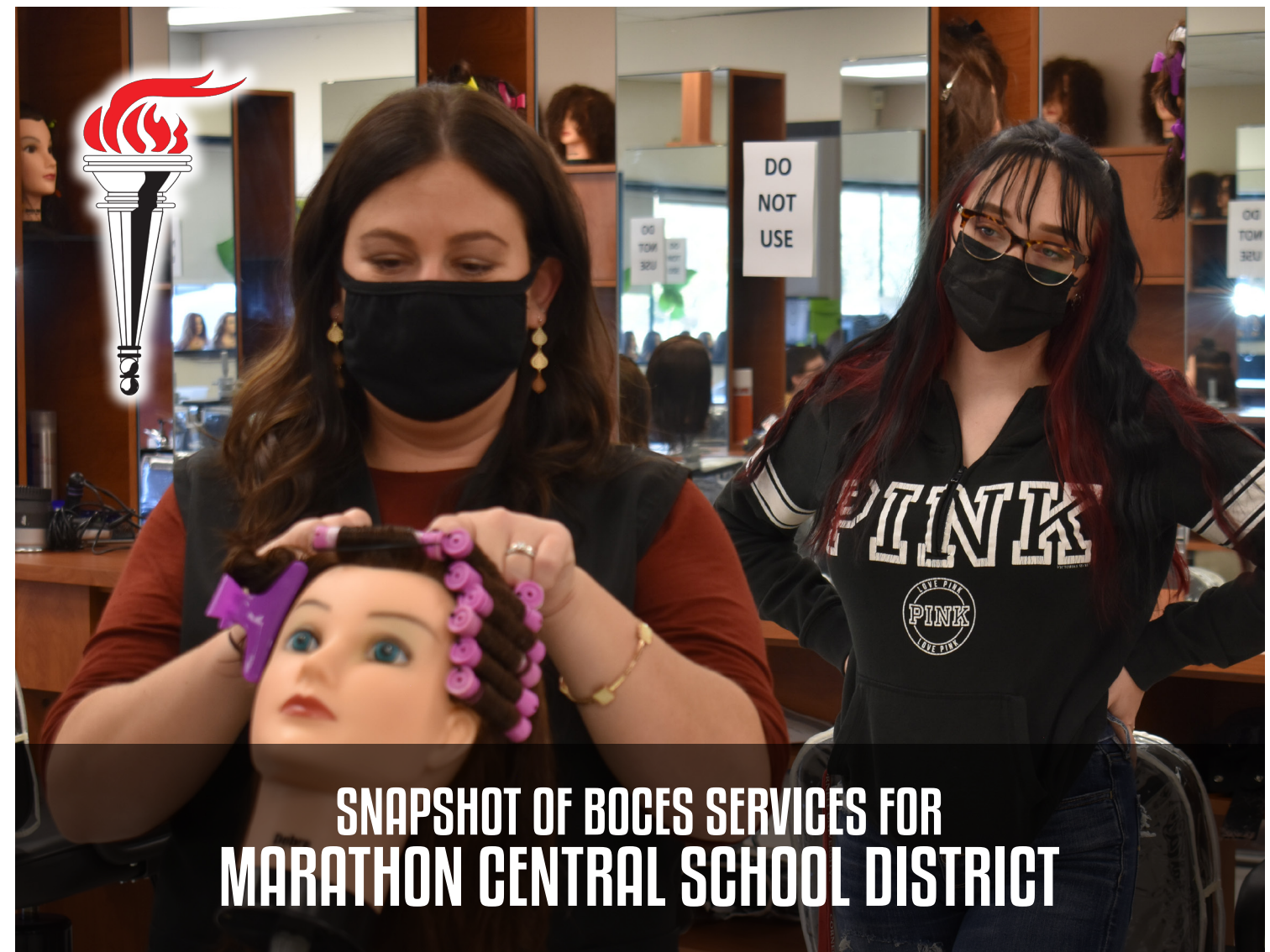

SNAPSHOT OF BOCES SERVICES FOR MARATHON CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT

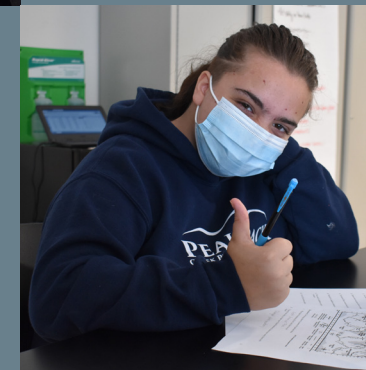


Marathon's share of the 2020-21 BOCES administrative budget

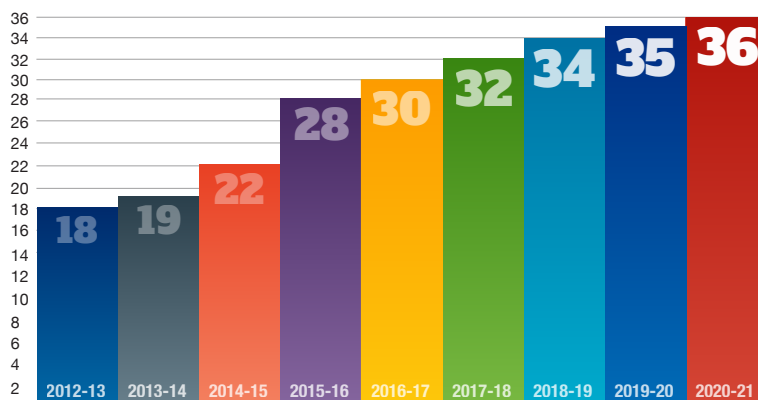
Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

Nathaniel Edsall, a sophomore from Marathon, points to several aspects of Seven Valleys New Tech Academy that have appealed to him since he first joined the high school as a freshman: smaller class sizes, individualized attention, a welcoming environment, and three subjects in particular — history, science and math — that continue to capture his interest.

But Nate says the hallmark of Seven Valleys — project-based learning — is what really gets him excited about school.

“I need the basic coursework, but project-based learning has really given me a taste of the real world, teaching me deadlines, teamwork and agency,” he said. “It’s also good to know that my work has impacted the community.”

As an example, Nate points to a recent project called “a community case study.”

Students had to do a project that involved selecting a local community, profiling it, and describing the sociological, ecological, and geographical movement in the region; unique features; associated regions; and reasons for settlers to live there. The project included a map about a key feature of the location. In Nate’s case, he and his classmates researched nearby Lapeer. Their key feature focused on Lapeer’s ability to sustain its natural agricultural environment while also making modifications, such as transportation corridors, so residents could thrive.

When it was finished, the poster was displayed at a local nature center “to educate the public on how to best conserve and effectively utilize land for human use,” Nate said.

Two of Nate’s facilitators, Maria Gimma and Gabby Pesce, say Nate is making significant progress at Seven Valleys. They describe him as a hard worker who is enthusiastic about learning, ready to take on challenges, and supportive of his peers. Nate, in turn, appreciates all of the positive interactions he has experienced at Seven Valleys.

“I’ve had a lot of support,” he said, “and I’ve become a much more knowledgeable person.”
