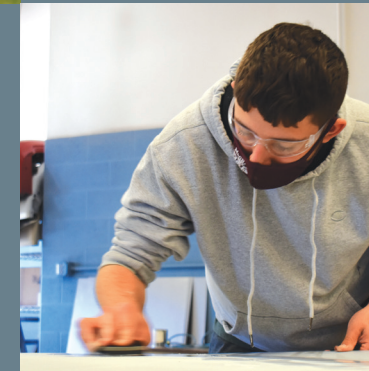


McGraw's share of the 2020-21 BOCES administrative budget

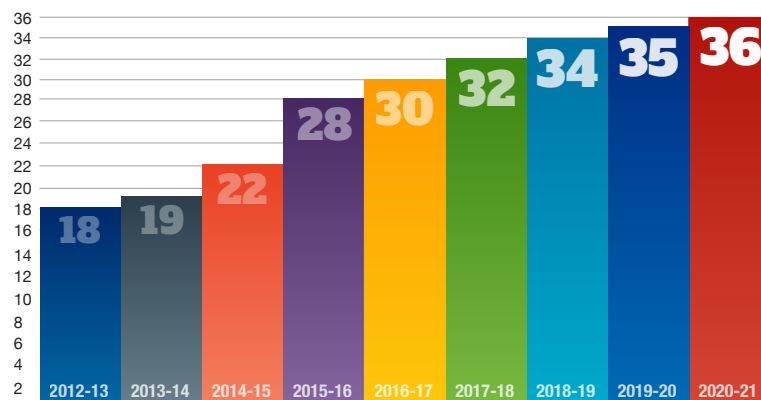
## Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

In 2020, 441 seniors from OCM BOCES' component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including McGraw students Crystin Burdick, Derek Cass, Dylan Clark, Cade Dodge, Evan Ignatowski, Shania Kenyon, Kourtney Lyon, Matthew Morse, Melaina Phillips, Maverick Stafford, Ahlexis Tetreault, Anthony Tinelli, Wanda Underwood, and Ashley White.

Number of classrooms in school district buildings that host BOCES Special Education Programs

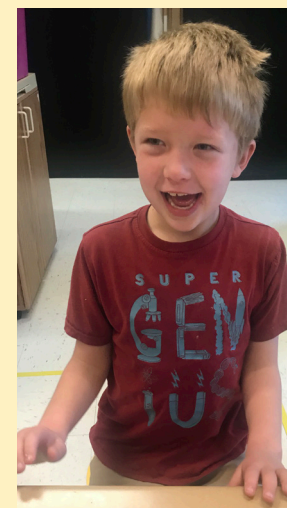

## OCM BOCES & McGraw = Student Success



Xavier Williams is a third-grader in the OCM BOCES STAR program at Homer Elementary School who loves interacting with his peers, reading books, and listening to the catchy, upbeat songs at morning meetings. He is a non-verbal student who communicates in all sorts of ways, using picture symbols, vocalizations, and gestures to express himself. He has a smile, his teacher says, "that radiates."

Since she first started working with Xavier last year, teacher Kristen Pille says the STAR program has helped him grow socially, behaviorally and academically. She attributes his success to the program's design, which allows the staff to focus on a student's individual needs as well as providing work-based instruction and living skills. She also credits a "great team that collaborates to provide the best services possible for Xavier." That team includes teachers, teaching assistants, related service providers, and Xavier's family.

Pille said Xavier enjoys coming to school each day, and everyone in the classroom looks forward to seeing him. His excitement for school shows when he jumps up and down during movement breaks, when he holds up the books he is especially excited about, or when he flashes that big grin.

His teaching assistant, Kristen Bobbette, said Xavier's positive spirit seems to rub off on everyone.

"He brings so much joy to our classroom with his enthusiasm and sense of wonder," she said.

## Did You Know?

This year, McGraw elementary school teachers are working with OCM BOCES to expand their understanding of the Science of Reading. The purpose of this training is to build the foundational knowledge of the research behind how the brain learns to read, while also continuing to build the instructional knowledge of those teachers who have been LETRS- trained. Teachers will be able to use this foundational knowledge around literacy and apply it to enhance their core literacy program.
