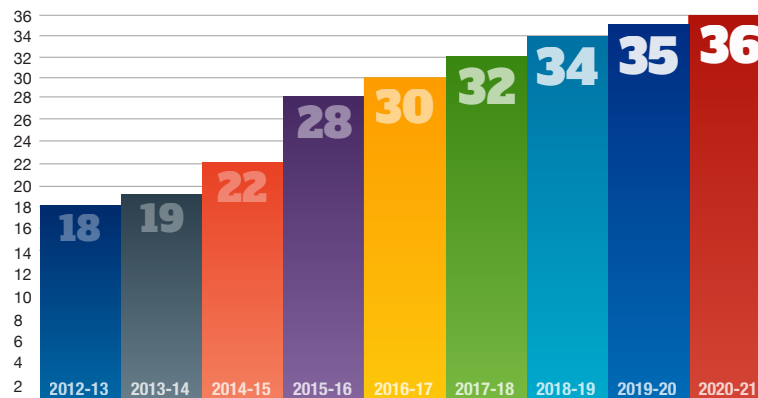
Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

In 2020, 441 seniors from OCM BOCES' component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including Solvay students Selena Ascenzo, Spencer Brabant, Cordiella Cole, Kirstyn Devereaux, Sara Emilo, Annaka Hunsinger, Joshua Piquet, Lian Pui, Madison Thomas, and Savannah Wade.

OCM BOCES & Solvay = Student Success



"Jacob is unstoppable," says his teacher, Susan Bruska.

Jacob Yager, a fourth-grader from the Solvay Union Free School District, has become a model student in the OCM BOCES SED program at Reynolds Elementary School in Baldwinsville. His teacher says "the small class size and one-on-one approach have given Jacob a chance to excel."

"The flexibility in setting and technique, paired with a positive reinforcement system and behavior modifications, have created an environment where Jacob can truly grow and reach his full potential," Bruska said.

This environment has also allowed Jacob to form strong relationships with teachers, social workers, and teaching assistants at BOCES. This, in turn, has helped Jacob better understand how to form relationships with his peers. As a result, he has developed many friendships during his time at BOCES and has also become a role model for other students.

"Jacob has demonstrated great progress and continues to grow academically, socially, and emotionally," Social Worker Karen Russo said. "He is a joy to have in class. We can always count on him to promote kindness and demonstrate empathy toward everyone."

In the program, Jacob has also learned essential coping skills. He credits BOCES for helping him learn how to handle his emotions.

"If I didn't have counseling, I don't think I would be where I am now," Jacob said. "I am happy."

Bruska could not be more proud.

"Jacob has handled all the curveballs thrown at him, such as remote learning and returning to school in a completely new space, with a positive attitude. He is driven and always wants to do his best. Jacob has shown us what hard work and dedication looks like, even just in the first six weeks of this new, unprecedented school year. If he continues on this trajectory, Jacob will be successful in all that he does."

Did You Know?

The Mid-State Regional Bilingual Education Resource Network provided financial support to the Solvay Union Free School District for expanded translation and interpretation services for English Language Learners (ELLs) and their families during the switch to remote learning last spring. This financial support provided additional pathways of communication in multiple languages to help ELLs and their families navigate the complexities of learning from home.
