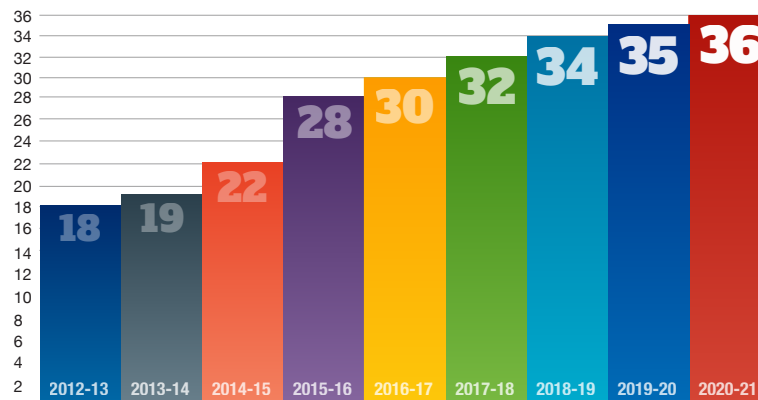
Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

OCM BOCES & West Genesee = Student Success



Every week, third-grader Mahmoud Zaqzouq enjoys "Fun Food Friday," one of his favorite activities in the OCM BOCES SKATE Program at Mott Road Elementary School in Fayetteville. Students have to follow directions, take turns, and describe what they like or dislike about a recipe. The activity is perfect for Mahmoud because he has a special fondness for crunchy snacks — "He loves food!" says his teacher, Corinne Campbell — and wants to be a baker when he gets older.

More importantly, the activity demonstrates how much progress Mahmoud has made in the SKATE classroom for students on the autism spectrum. The classroom utilizes a research-based approach that offers a structured routine, a predictable schedule, a positive reinforcement plan, and an environment that emphasizes visual learning. Because it is housed in a public school, the students also benefit from learning and interacting with their general education peers.

Mahmoud joined the program in kindergarten and is still making progress on a daily basis, Campbell said. For example, he is learning how to communicate on his Augmentative & Alternative Communication device, which allows him to express his wants and needs. During a recent project, Mahmoud enjoyed making a name tree based on the "Chicka Chicka Boom Boom" bestselling children's book.

Mahmoud also loves to read books and magazines, especially those with real-life photographs. No matter what he is doing, his positive attitude and energetic spirit are contagious, his teachers say.

"Mahmoud's excitement for school brings so much happiness to our classroom," Campbell said. "We love seeing him smile and hearing his giggle."

His social worker, Samantha Cangro, agreed.

"It has been a joy to see Mahmoud excel in the SKATE program over the last few years," she said. "I have witnessed his engagement and interactions with staff first-hand, as well as his love for school."

Did You Know?

West Genesee teacher Kim Smith participated in the Central New York Teacher Leadership Program (CNYTLP). Kim worked with CNYTLP teachers and her district mentor, Darlene Chapin, to learn the roles and responsibilities of a teacher leader. In addition to classroom study, Kim engaged in hands-on learning that included leading a data discussion, professional learning session, and book talk. Kim also worked with her course instructors and mentor to craft a district-issue analysis presentation. This created a network that allows West Genesee Special Education teachers to share their expertise and improve student outcomes.
