Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the guality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by District Administration magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

The Homer senior has been learning about dozens of careers in the field, job shadowing professionals, and earning college credits through Tompkins Cortland Community College.

Alina is grateful for the chance to get a head start on her college credits, but she also appreciates the two-year program for sealing her desire to study physical therapy in college. Her goal is to earn a doctorate degree, then practice in the field.

For Alina, the program affirmed her career goal and prepared her well for life as a college student. She has excellent study skills, listens, collaborates with others, shows self-motivation, and is "reliable, motivated and respectful of her peers," Bosco said.

"Alina is always ready to use her critical thinking and problem-solving skills when completing a problem or project," Bosco said. "Overall, I feel these skills, as well as her work ethic and leadership qualities, will lead to a very successful future."
