



The School Library System (SLS) mission is to "enable school districts to share library resources and support access to information to achieve educational goals." The SLS provides in school and home access to the following resources to staff and students within the OCM BOCES region at no charge.

- **TeachingBooks.net** A *PreK-12 website*, contains original, in-studio movies of authors and illustrators, audio excerpts of professional book readings, guides to titles and multimedia resources on children's and young adult literature.
- **First Search** Delivers bibliographic records/library holdings from OCLC WorldCat and electronic journals. Includes access to *Wilson Select Plus*, which provides full text articles in science, humanities, education and business.
- Newsbank Includes: Syracuse Post Standard 1986+, Syracuse Herald Journal 1986-2001, Syracuse Herald American 1986-2001, and Albany Times Union 1986+ for a total of 100+ NYS and 1,000 national newspapers. Online resources include: Stateline.org 2007+ and Slate 1996+, 30 full text popular magazines and America's Obituaries and Death Notices.
- ASCD Gale Virtual Reference Library The Association of Supervision and Curriculum Development and Gale Cengage
 have partnered to bring you professional development books in eBook format. Topics include educational issues from teaching
 methodology and practices to leadership and community issues. Includes 56 titles.

- Health and Wellness Resource Center and Alternative Health Module A source for both medical care professionals and consumers concerning important current health information. Contains 800+ full-text titles. Includes 400 health/medical journals, 700+ health related videos, articles from 2,200+ general interest publications and Gale Reference titles Coverage 1980+.
- Business Company Resource Center This comprehensive database brings together a wide variety of global business information including company profiles, as well as business magazines and newspapers. Full text from 3,000+ periodicals.
- Infotrac Custom Newspapers Offers over 150 full-text newspapers that include several NYS newspapers including the New York Times from 1995 to the present.
- National Newspaper Index Available since July 2003, provides article citations from 1977 to present for the New York Times, Wall Street Journal, Christian Science Monitor, Los Angles Times and the Washington Post.
- Twayne Authors Series Includes: 600 full-text titles: 200 each from Twayne World, US, and English authors. This series is devoted to literary critical interpretation and discussion for readers ranging from high school students through college and above.

- **Encyclopedia Americana** Articles include links to further readings, a bibliography, selected full text articles, web page links and links to related Encyclopedia Americana articles.
