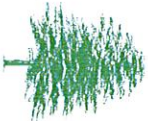
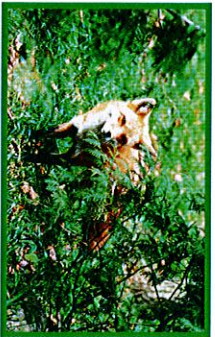


Meet the Instructor . . .

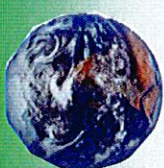
New Vision eligibility requirements and application process:
