



LAWS OF NEW YORK-By Authority

CHAPTER 723

AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to the Master Plan For School District Reorganization and making an appropriation therefor

Became a law April 18, 1956, with the approval of the Governor. Passed, by a majority vote, three-fifths being present

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Article seven of the education law is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section, to be section three hundred fourteen, to read as follows:

§ 314. Master Plan For School District Reorganization. The commissioner of education is hereby authorized to continue the investigations, study and review carried on by the joint legislative committee on the state education system in order to bring up to date the Master Plan For School District Reorganization (legislative document number twentyfive of nineteen hundred forty-seven); to make such studies and surveys as are necessary to review periodically and maintain such plan currently; to hold hearings in relation to affected areas for the purpose of eliciting the expression of opinion, cooperation and assistance of the inhabitants of such areas; and to make recommendations for school district reorganization so as to assure the most efficient and economical provision of educational facilities for such areas. Such recommendations shall be principally directed toward the reorganization of areas in and around the city school districts of cities having less than one hundred twenty-five thousand inhabitants, the reorganization of the remaining common and union free school districts not included in such urban and suburban areas and the reorganization of the smaller central school districts. The commissioner of education is hereby authorized, further, to amend such master plan as established by such joint legislative committee on the basis of his investigations, study and review, by orders made by him and entered in his office. Nothing herein contained shall delay, or interfere with, the exercise of the powers of the commissioner of education vested in him by articles thirty-seven or forty or sections fifteen hundred twenty-four, fifteen hundred twenty-five or fifteen hundred twenty-six of the education law.

EXPLANATION—Matter italicized is new; matter in brackets [] is old law to be omitted.

BRIEF HISTORY

Reorganization of school districts has been a continuing process since 1812, at which time the State of New York was divided into school districts. As the State developed and population grew, additional school districts were formed. At the same time, adjustments were made in the existing districts to the end that it was rather hard to determine the exact number of districts existing on any given date. By 1845 it was estimated that there were about 11,000 school districts.

Even at this early date it was recognized that in order to provide better educational opportunities, school districts should be reorganized. The Free School Act of 1851 and the Union Free School Act of 1853 provided impetus for reorganization of districts and enrichment of the school program. From this date on the number of districts gradually decreased.

The Legislature recognized the necessity of providing more rapid reorganization, and as a result the Central Rural School Act was passed in 1914. This act had very little effect on combining school districts.

In 1919 the Legislature went all the way in reorganization of school districts by establishing township school districts in place of the existing common schools. This proved so unpopular that the following year the Township Act was repealed.

Following the repeal of the Township Act, the Committee of 21 was organized. As a result of its studies, the so-called Cole-Rice Act was passed amending the State aid laws. Under the Cole-Rice Act additional State aid was granted to central schools. From that time on the number of central school districts increased very rapidly.

For the first few years the number of districts brought into any centralization were few in number, so as a result many of these early centralizations were small.

In 1938 the Board of Regents made an inquiry into the cost and character of education. Among other things, the Inquiry recommended that no new central district be formed with less than 600 pupils in average daily attendance and proposed a minimum of 1,200 where possible. It did not set up any definite plan of reorganization.

In 1942 the Joint Legislative Committee on the State Education System began the task of creating a Master Plan for School District Reorganization. This plan, completed in 1947, was not compulsory, but it did provide a pattern for laying out central schools and reorganizing the State system generally.

Growth and Development of Central Schools

The first central school was organized in 1914. There was no financial incentive granted to districts desiring to reorganize and nothing more

was done for a period of 10 years, or until the Cole-Rice Act was passed in 1925. From that time on centralization has gone forward at a rapid pace, so today (1958) more than 90 percent of the rural area has been centralized. Table I shows the number of districts centralized during the period of 1914 to 1957.

It should be noted that the early centralizations, as a rule, were small but the central school movement represented one of the outstanding accomplishments for better education to the rural children.

The recommendations of the Regents' Inquiry had an effect on the size of the districts laid out, but it was not until the Joint Legislative Committee on the State Education System began its study was there a decided increase in the size of the central districts.

Heald Commission Recommendations

By chapter 143 of the Laws of 1954, amended by chapter 6 of the Laws of 1955, a Temporary Commission on Educational Finances was set up. Known as the Heald Commission since its chairman was Henry T. Heald, chancellor of New York University, this commission gave consideration to school district reorganization. In one of its first pronouncements it said, "The soundest long-range means for overcoming many of the inadequacies of schools and lack of ability to support schools locally is the strengthening of the school district itself." The commission reaffirmed the recommendations of the Regents' Inquiry as follows: "The absolute lower limit of 600 pupils and the minimum goal of 1,200 pupils in average daily attendance, as far as cost efficiency is concerned, continue to be sound."

The Heald Commission made two recommendations:

- 1. "The Legislature continue to encourage the formation of central districts and enlarged city school districts and that it take steps immediately to foster the combination of small-area and small-enrollment central districts."
- 2. "The State Education Department be authorized and directed to bring the 'Master Plan' up to date upon due notice and opportunity for a hearing by any school district affected by proposed changes. It is further recommended that the Legislature appropriate sufficient funds to the Department for this purpose in order to have the revised 'Master Plan' ready as soon as possible. Provisions also should be made for keeping up to date the revised plan."

City Central Schools and Enlarged City School Disricts

Chapter 610 of the Laws of 1950 authorized the formation of central school districts in cities of less than 10,000.

Chapter 810 of the Laws of 1952 authorized cities with less than 125,000 to enlarge their city school district boundaries without affecting

the municipal boundaries. As a result of these two statutes, all the cities of less than 10,000 population, seven in number, have been organized as city central school districts. Of the other cities of less than 125,000 population, 16 have formed enlarged city school districts.

REORGANIZATION OF MASTER PLAN

By chapter 723 of the Laws of 1956 the Commissioner of Education was authorized and directed to bring the 1947 Master Plan for School District Reorganization up to date and keep up to date the revised plan.

The Commissioner of Education appointed an Advisory Committee of 17 to work with Mr. Arvie Eldred and a staff on this project.

The 1,465 districts still in existence are classified as follows:

Under chapter 723 of the Laws of 1956 it was stated, "Such recommendations shall be principally directed toward the reorganization of areas in and around the city school districts of cities having less than one hundred twenty-five thousand inhabitants, the reorganization of the remaining common and union free school districts not included in such urban and suburban areas and the reorganization of the smaller central school districts."

GUIDE TO SCHOOL DISTRICT REORGANIZATION

The staff and Advisory Committee sought expert advice from many fields in drawing up a Guide for revision of the Master Plan. This Guide has been printed in a separate document and should at all times be used in connection with the Revised Master Plan. The following is a summary of the Guide used in formulating the revision:

DEFINITIONS AND CHARACTERISTICS OF SCHOOL DISTRICTS

A school district is a unit of local government established to carry out the State's constitutional responsibility to provide adequate educational opportunities for the children residing within the district.

A school attendance unit is a locally defined area within which children attend a particular school building. A school district may embrace one or more attendance units.

Contracting districts form a portion of the attendance units of other functioning school districts.

OBJECTIVES OF SCHOOL DISTRICT REORGANIZATION

In effect every school district has the responsibility by law to provide secondary schooling for its children. Therefore, the basic objective of school district reorganization is to secure the formation of school districts in all areas of the State which contain within their respective boundaries one or more elementary attendance units with at least one adequate secondary, grades 7-12, program. Each of these districts must be so constituted as to realize the full potential of the community concerned in providing for the education of its children. In each instance the district machinery should secure the fullest possible equalization of educational opportunity for the youth of the rural community.

FACTORS OF CONSIDERATION IN FORMULATION OF SCHOOL DISTRICTS

The factors which determine the size of a school district are:

- The size of the various attendance units necessary to achieve a minimum foundation program and, if possible, curriculum enrichment programs at reasonable cost
- 2. The ability of a given area to provide an adequate base of financial support
- The community of interest and ability of the area concerned to provide the local lay interest and leadership necessary
- 4. Proper consideration for efficient and economical use of specialized and administrative personnel
- The sparsity of pupil population and the transportation possibilities within a given geographic area

These factors cannot be applied with equal effect and results in all areas of the State.

EFFICIENT UTILIZATION OF STAFF

Enlargement of school attendance units at least up to the optimums suggested makes possible more efficient utilization of teacher time and talents.

BASIC MINIMUMS

Every school district in the State should provide the acceptable minimum foundation program prescribed by the Legislature and Board of Regents, from the kindergarten level through the 12th grade. This means that each district must have at least one elementary (K-6) and one secondary (7-12) attendance unit.

ELEMENTARY MINIMUM AND OPTIMUM

The minimum acceptable elementary attendance unit should be of sufficient size to provide solid units of each grade with an enrollment

of from 20 to 30 pupils. This means from 140 to 210 pupils per K-6 elementary school. An optimum of from 420 to 630 pupils in grades K-6 should be sought wherever possible to achieve the economical use of both specialized personnel and specialized building facilities.

SECONDARY MINIMUM

The minimum size of a school district is determined by the secondary enrollment. In areas where both sparsity of population and the difficulty of pupil transportation combine to govern the situation, the minimum combined junior-senior high school enrollment (7-12) should be not less than 500 pupils. Any smaller enrollment must result in a severely limited program or extremely excessive cost.

SECONDARY OPTIMUM

A careful review of the studies and data available indicates that the possibility of providing an adequate secondary educational program, a qualified staff of subject specialists, a suitable physical plant and sufficient financial resources all at a reasonable cost to the taxpayer exists only in a school with a secondary enrollment of more than 500 students. These same studies indicate that separate junior and senior high schools are preferable to a combined high school and that an adequate program and staff can most successfully and economically be provided for a separate junior and senior high school of 700 or more pupils each.

The number of pupils in the high school is of great importance in the selection and utilization of staff members. Since the number and size of classes are directly affected by the size of the school, it is possible in the school with adequate enrollment to schedule classes in particular fields to attract and hold teachers with special abilities. In the larger school, in the field of English, for example, it is possible to employ teachers who are specialists in journalism, dramatics and public speaking. Teachers with special interests in particular branches can be hired to teach specific classes in science, mathematics, business and foreign language.

In the school with limited enrollment, it is necessary for teachers to handle classes in two, three or four areas. A teacher may have a special interest in only one area and may have inadequate preparation to do a good teaching job in some of the classes to which he may be assigned. According to the best judgment of specialists in these areas, it requires a minimum pupil enrollment of at least 700 in grades 10, 11 and 12 to provide a diversified program and staff of competent teachers.

The modern secondary school, which must provide for the instruction of the bright pupil as well as the average and below average in ability, requires a competent staff in both the required and elective subjects. Where there are multiple classes of subjects, it is possible to group the especially bright pupils and provide a program which may be either accelerated in time or broadened greatly in terms of content so that their capabilities may be developed.

VOCATIONAL EDUCATION

There is an increasing demand for secondary vocational and technical education in New York State. Unless this demand is to be met entirely on a State level (which is not recommended) consideration must be given to the formation of school districts having enrollments approaching 1,400 and more in a senior high school attendance unit. These programs are expensive in terms of equipment and personnel and limited in terms of the number of pupils enrolled in a given area of instruction. Experience in New York State has shown that few senior high schools of under 700 enrollment can successfully offer the various types of vocational education. To achieve a reasonable optimum of vocational offerings an enrollment of 1,400 pupils in senior high school attendance unit is required.

TRANSPORTATION—A KEY CONSIDERATION

The transportation of pupils to the school they attend is a key auxiliary service to be considered when reorganizing school districts. It is possible in sufficiently populated areas to locate modern size school buildings within walking distances of the homes of the pupils. However, in order to obtain satisfactory school enrollments in the less populated areas, it is necessary to include pupils who live at greater than walking distances from the school buildings.

BASIC TRANSPORTATION FACTORS

There are four interrelated factors which need to be considered in planning for the transportation of pupils: first, the operating speed of the vehicle used; second, the number of stops required to pick up the pupils; third, the time the pupils reasonably may be expected to spend going to school; fourth, the distance needed to be traveled to bring the pupils to the school.

It is quite generally agreed that the maximum time pupils should be required to spend traveling on a bus is approximately one hour although it is often necessary to exceed this maximum in cases of single families living in isolated parts of the school district. The optimum maximum time range for a pupil to be riding on a bus is between 35 and 45 minutes.

There seems to be no fixed standard for the distance a pupil reasonably should be expected to travel. Instead, a reasonable distance is usually determined from an acceptable time limit. A simple formula for use under average transportation conditions is as follows:

TRANSPORTATION FORMULA

Time in minutes equals twice the number of miles traveled plus one minute for each pupil stop. (Example: A bus trip 12 miles long after the first pupil stop with 15 pupil stops to the end of the route would require 39 minutes.)

When the speed of the vehicle and the number of pupil stops are converted into time, it can be seen that the maximum acceptable distance for a pupil to be transported is determined by the acceptable time limit a pupil should be expected to spend traveling to school.

REDUCING PUPIL TIME ON BUSES

There are various means by which the time a pupil may be required to spend on a bus may be decreased. Among these are the establishment of definite bus stops, the use of various size buses to meet particular situations and consideration of separate secondary and elementary patterns.

SUMMARY

With the use of A Guide to School District Reorganization, each of the three areas recommended for reorganization by the statutes were studied and recommendations made.

Areas around Cities of Less than 125,000

Of the 62 cities, 6 have a population in excess of 125,000 and 7 have a population of less than 10,000. Therefore, 49 cities were subjected to study for enlarged city school districts. Sixteen of these cities had already taken in contiguous territory and therefore had become enlarged city school districts. There are 23 city school districts which have contiguous outlying territory that should be annexed. These 23 districts may become enlarged city school districts under the Revised Master Plan.

Village Superintendencies (Independent Union Free Schools)

There are 112 such districts. Of this number, 42 have already centralized and retained their superintendency status. The study shows that there are still 23 existing union free schools under superintendents that should centralize by taking in contiguous territory.

In regard to these districts, population trends were studied, true valuation per pupil was considered, and the problem of sparsity, which involves the matter of transportation, was reviewed. For the present it would not seem feasible to recommend reorganization or combination of all of these districts. However, the Revised Master Plan suggests that 111 of these districts be either combined or consolidated with city districts or union free school districts under a superintendent.

Union Free Schools

Of the 152 union free schools, 70 have grades K-12, 66 have grades K-6, 13 have grades K-9 and 3 are contract. The Revised Master Plan provides that all of these districts, except 30, be annexed to existing districts, or become part of a proposed central school district. Of the 30 districts, 2 are in the Upstate Area and 28 are in the Metropolitan Area. Three of the districts in the Metropolitan Area are isolated island districts in Suffolk County and for the present should retain their status. One district in Clinton County should retain its present status for the time being because it is largely supported by a special foundation. All the other districts are in rapidly growing areas and until more reliable population trends are available, should retain their present status.

Common Schools

There are 688 common school districts, of which 229 operate schools for their elementary children and contract with other districts for their secondary children. There are 459 common districts which do not operate schools and contract with other districts for the education of all of their children.

The Revised Reorganization Plan suggests that all these districts be annexed to the districts which now are receiving their children, or be combined with proposed districts.

Purpose of Reorganization Plan

The Plan outlined herein is designed as a blueprint to guide the State Education Department and the people in the communities in their desire to effect more efficient and more economical schools. It is not compulsory.

The citizens in the 9,000 districts of the State have, by their own choice, desired to have a better school reorganization. It is the belief that as the citizens of these districts study their school problems, this blueprint will be of help to them in reaching a satisfactory solution to the end that the children in their areas will be given the best educational opportunity for the future.

- 2. "School Referred to"—This is the popular or local name for the school district. There is often more than one name. The one selected is that used by the Bureau of Rural Administrative Services and/or the Bureau of Publications in the State Education Department.
- 3. "Date Effective"—Chapter 637 of the Laws of 1944 changed the order of laying out and designating a central school district, such change to become effective April 7, 1944. After that date, for central school districts, the "date effective" is the same date as the "date of meeting."
- 4. Boundary alterations are omitted except where an entire district is involved.






