    - Even in units that are not Full-PBL there are pieces and parts of PBL that make every unit better. There are more interdisciplinary lessons than ever.
    - Coaching really makes a difference. It can get a team back on track when they are struggling.
    - A flexible-block schedule enables the team of teachers to use time creatively.
    - It is important that teachers have unpacked their standards in order to ensure that projects are standards-based.
    - Good PBL units are planned with a standards-based, backward design approach.
    - If the standards-based approach isn't adhered to a project, it can get out of control.
