Report from Middle-Level Liaisons Meeting

- Steve Dunham reported on the meeting (he represents the BOCES to the Liaisons)
 - It is expected that districts will be on "lists" as participation rate becomes a multi-year issue. It is not clear what penalties or requirements would be.
 - There are many resources at NYSMSA.org for middle-level schools
 - The implementation of RTI
 - Varies greatly from school to school
 - Some schools are flexible about it, others have a rigid schedule that makes it difficult
 - Some middle schools are implementing a common intervention period
 - Some schools still doing traditional AIS model
 - The state has some <u>resources</u> about the role of research in the Common Core at engageny
 - Barbara Stripling, now at SU's Ischool, has a great approach to inquiry that complements the middle school philosophy and 21C readiness
