#### **Meeting Topics**

- Summer School
  - Before report cards are printed, districts will verify how they want final grades to be determined (whether and how to factor in the previous year's work into the final grade for credit purposes)
  - Beginning with the 2014, additional support for Students with Disabilities (SWD) will be provided at Regional Summer School. The concept was as a result of work with various stakeholders throughout our region based on the direction from the Superintendents' Instructional Support Services Committee. The data from previous summers indicate that the rate of success for SWDs is lower than for general education students. This pointed to the need to do something different. Also, there were some concerns whether the level of support previously supported was congruent with the support SWDs receive during the regular school year. Students with Disabilities will be enrolled in a course called "Instructional Support" in addition to their classes. This course will provide the following supports:
    - Support for work in courses vocabulary, formulae, organization, etc.
    - Consultation by the special educators with general education teachers
    - Modifications/Accommodations for assessments, finals, and Regents examinations

This model replaces the previous testing center approach. Because this is an additional course it does limit SWDs to two courses (plus this supports).

#### • 3-8 Assessment Issues

- The first cohorts of PBL 102 have been announced! These courses are designed for two teachers (and, if possible, their teacher librarian) who are co-teaching an integrated PBL course. One section of PBL 102 will be for humanities (an ELA and social studies partnership) and another section of PBL 102 will be for an ELA/science partnership. The course begins with four days of training and then continues throughout the year with networking, support, and PBL coaching.
