Meeting Topics

APPR implementation

- o Most are bringing electronic devices into classrooms for evidence collection.
- Heavier reliance on technology and web-based solutions for APPR and evidence collections does make us more vulnerable to technology failures
- We all have questions about long-term absences and teacher of record, SLOS, etc.
- There is a sense in some cultures to "go easy" in year one either with ratings or conversion scales. Be careful because it will be extremely difficult to make adjustments in subsequent years

• Common Core implementation

- There are more and more curriculum modules/materials being added to engageNY, more for <u>ELA</u> than <u>math</u>, but some for each.
- We had a discussion about math materials. Some districts that had been using Everyday math are moving away from it, others are beefing it up with supplemental, materials and moving things around.
- One district has selected MyMath.
- o Other districts trying to hold out until there are more things from which to choose.
- Some are also dissatisfied with their ELA series, particularly because of the over

 reliance on fiction.
- The Network team will hold "Consumer Reports" sessions in February to help districts be smart consumers of the curriculum materials. These will be announced at BCIC next week.

• Managing the Dignity Act (and other behavioral incidents) Paperwork

- There is a heightened awareness from all parties as a result of the attention and education efforts, including parents.

- Some districts are still in the process of designing their forms.
- o Principals are keeping these forms for later when the reporting has to be done.
- It seems like the documentation itself actually is a deterrent in some cases with some students.
- One district has made their form be a fill-in-able .pdf that then gets forwarded to the social worker and the principal. Sometimes the teacher has handled it and sometimes intervention is needed.
- Having two sets of forms (other discipline and DASA-incidents) is a bit cumbersome – one sometimes leads to the other.
