• Common Core implementation

- Update on curriculum modules look at chart of all districts
- School districts discussed ELA programs that are currently being implemented in their elementary schools.
- East Syracuse-Minoa CSD, Woodland Elementary
 - Discussed how the school has embraced using QR codes to enhance instruction.

 - The principal will be presenting on this topic at the ASCD conference.
 - Currently using Lucy Calkins Literacy Series.
 - The principal stated that he uses "WinTime" as their common intervention period. Students receiving Tier 2 interventions receive the help during school wide scheduled time.
 - Students receiving Tier 3 interventions receive support twice as much as their peers receiving Tier 2 interventions.
 - Woodland Elementary uses Comprehensive Toolkit to help schedule time for student interventions.
 - Helps to provide common teacher record keeping.
 - Professional Learning Community (PLC)
 - Staff meets regularly at the end of the school day
 - If the need arises teachers carve out time during the school day to meet with each other.
 - Principal encourages teachers to visit each other's classrooms.
 - Principal regularly covers classes for teachers to sit in lessons for other grade levels.
 - This practice leads to vertical aligning of curriculum.
- o Chittenango CSD, Bridgeport Elementary School
 - Is currently in the process of implementing Fountas and Pinnell Genre Study in kindergarten through fifth grade. In combination with Fountas and Pinnell LLI,
 - This program is aligned with CCLS in ELA
 - Provides a framework of teaching and developing questions around literary topics.
 - Discovered this program through ongoing LLI meetings.

SU Study Council project and request

- The Study Council is looking to expand the Research, Development and Dissemination Project.
 - Current project is focused on discussions with parents
 - Looking to expand project to incorporate growth and accountability conversations with teachers during the APPR evaluation process.
 - Looking to initially target pre-service administrators and then will expand to relatively new school administrators.
 - Attempting to develop scripts for retired teachers and administrators that will play the roles of teachers in the growth conversation scenarios.
 - Researchers are looking for volunteers to help in the development of scenarios.
 - This project is based on Ben Dodger's work.
- Feedback provided by elementary principals
 - Team pre-service administrators to simulate collegial relationships to get advice/ council.
 - Elementary principals that have participated in the current project stated there
 was a need for more elementary situations. These individuals indicated
 many of the secondary situations had little relevance on their current work.
