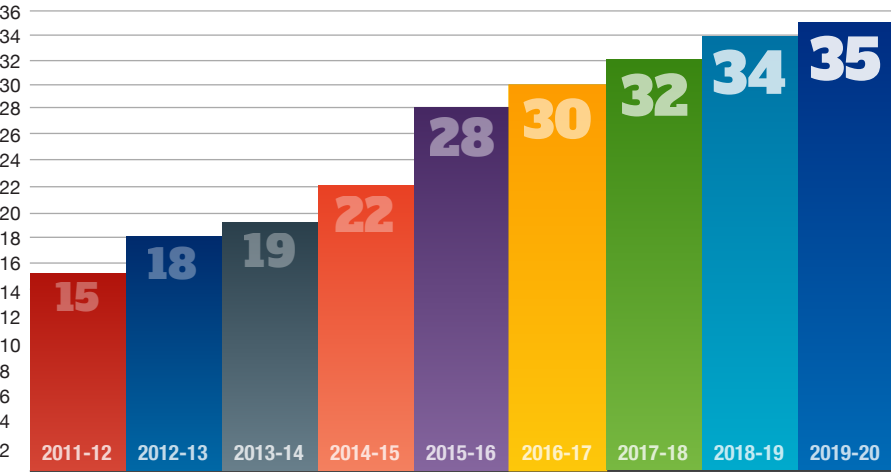
Career & Technical Education

New York State’s approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

Cortland senior Jacob Congdon entered the OCM BOCES Computer Technology program with a strong computer background. Even so, Jacob has greatly expanded his computer skills during his past two years in the class, according to his instructor, Richard Tokar. Last year, for example, Jacob passed a CompTIA certification that affirms his knowledge of fundamental Information Technology (IT) skills.

“Jacob has definitely enhanced his skills through the OCM BOCES Computer Tech program,” Tokar said. “This is evident through the excellent questions he asks in class and the astute observations he makes when troubleshooting.”

Jacob has enjoyed the program’s combination of hands-on work and theory. He also cites class field trips as one of the program’s biggest highlights, since they have exposed him to potential colleges and the wide variety of ways that technology can be used. This year, for example, the class took a field trip to the Central New York Parade of Homes, where they met with a contractor specializing in “smart home” technology.

“This program has helped me a lot,” Jacob said. “I like that this is an actual trade, a career path that I can use after I graduate. For example, I passed the CompTIA certification last year, which I can transfer outside of school to the career field.”

Jacob is currently deciding between enrolling in college or enlisting in the National Guard. Whatever path he chooses, he believes the computer skills he picked up at OCM BOCES will be invaluable. Just as important, Tokar believes Jacob has a pleasant, outgoing personality that will suit him in any professional environment.

“Jacob is a great team player and has a fantastic sense of humor,” Tokar said. “He is a leader in the Career & Technical Education classroom.”

Did You Know?

Corland is currently hosting the Coaching Academy for instructional coaches and administrators from the 23 component districts. The purpose of the Coaching Academy is to train and support instructional coaches and other leaders to increase student learning and positively influence teacher and team effectiveness. Participants are partnering with Just Ask to increase their sense of individual and collective efficacy; understand the various roles and responsibilities of instructional coaches; understand the teaching learning cycle; and engage in collaboration and foster meaningful collaboration of others.
