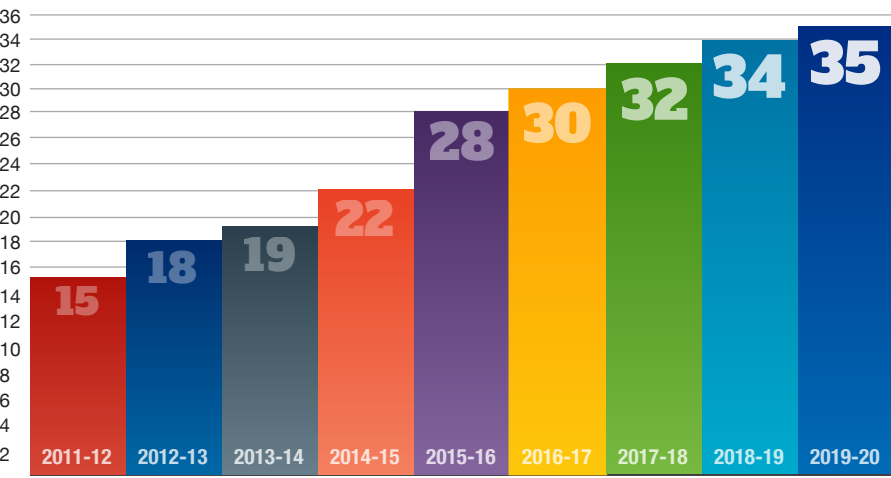
Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

In 2019, nearly 440 seniors from OCM BOCES’ component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including East Syracuse Minoa students Sabastian Almonte, December Cooke, Andaria Hill-Oviedo, and Chloe Morgan.

OCM BOCES & East Syracuse Minoa = Student Success



Fourth-grader Alex Ingles is making significant progress in the highly visual, structured and nurturing environment of the OCM BOCES SKATE program at East Syracuse Elementary School. The program, which stands for Scaffolding Kids’ Abilities Through Education, provides individualized education and psychotherapeutic assistance for students on the autism spectrum. Alex benefits from the structure and routine of the program because it offers, among other features, a visual and written schedule; a “first-then” board that guides him through an expected sequence of activities and rewards; and clear expectations about his work and classroom rules, according to his teacher, Mary Beth Crysler.

“Alex has benefited from SKATE because it provides the support and consistency he needs to be successful both academically and socially,” she said.

One of the biggest benefits of the program is its location. Because the SKATE classroom is housed at East Syracuse Elementary School, Alex routinely participates in specials — art, music, physical education, and library — with his general education peers. Crysler said Alex can take part in these lessons and “really enjoys using his elementary peers as models.”

As for Alex, he loves many aspects of his school day, from the pop-rock music of “Imagine Dragons” to being able to run and move in physical education.

But his favorite part of the program is clear: “My teachers!” he said.

Did You Know?

Responsive Classroom is part of East Syracuse Minoa’s strategic plan. Teachers from the district’s four elementary schools and the Park Hill Pre-K send participants to the Responsive Classroom core and advanced courses held at OCM BOCES. Responsive Classroom practices assist teachers with strategies to support the Harvey Silver “Thoughtful Classroom-Effective Teaching Framework.”
