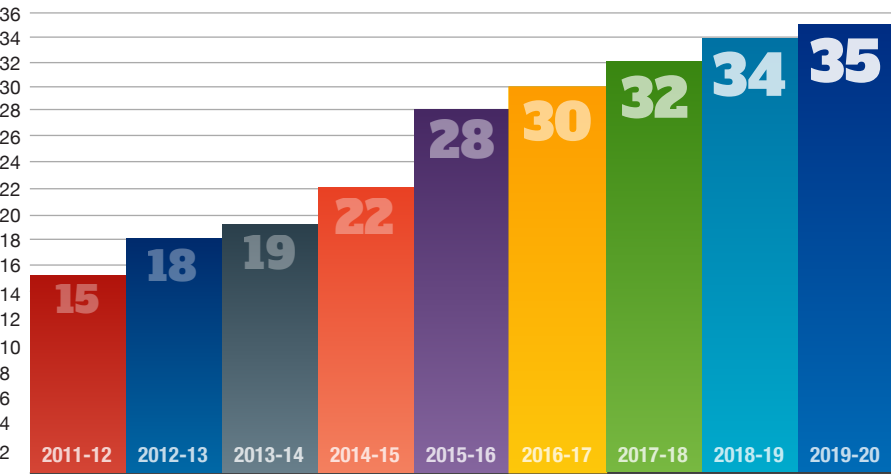
Career & Technical Education

New York State’s approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

Seven Valleys New Tech Academy has proven to be the perfect fit for Justin Dermott, a freshman from the Homer Central School District. Since entering the program in September, Justin has enjoyed the school’s sense of community, calling it “another family.” He takes his work seriously, especially because the school emphasizes collaborating in groups, and he knows that others are often relying on him to get his work done.

One of Justin’s facilitators, Elisa Rodriguez, says Justin has grown into a more independent thinker during his first few months at Seven Valleys, while also making meaningful contributions in his work groups.

“Justin always puts forth effort and works well with all of his peers,” Rodriguez said. “He is an active member of his classes and works hard to set up himself, and his peers, for success. He contributes positively to our school culture.”

When asked what he enjoys most about OCM BOCES, Justin is quick to focus on the merits of Project Based Learning, especially since many of the projects relate to activities he enjoys outside of school. Justin also likes the combination classes offered at Seven Valleys, such as GlobalLit and Espanarte. These features, plus the smaller class sizes, have helped him excel.

“I enjoy my classes and participating with others,” Justin said. “I also appreciate that I get to earn college credits by taking classes in high school.”

Justin embodies the school’s sense of community both inside and outside of school, Rodriguez said. In school, Justin is always willing to lend a helping hand to students and staff. He often volunteers for school events, including the recent open house and art show. He presented to the Seven Valleys Advisory Council. Outside of school, Justin volunteers throughout the Homer community and the Rotary Interact Club in Cortland, an international service club for teenagers.

“Justin is a role model for other students by being an active participant in classes, in our school, and the Cortland community,” Rodriguez said. “He exemplifies a Seven Valleys student.”
