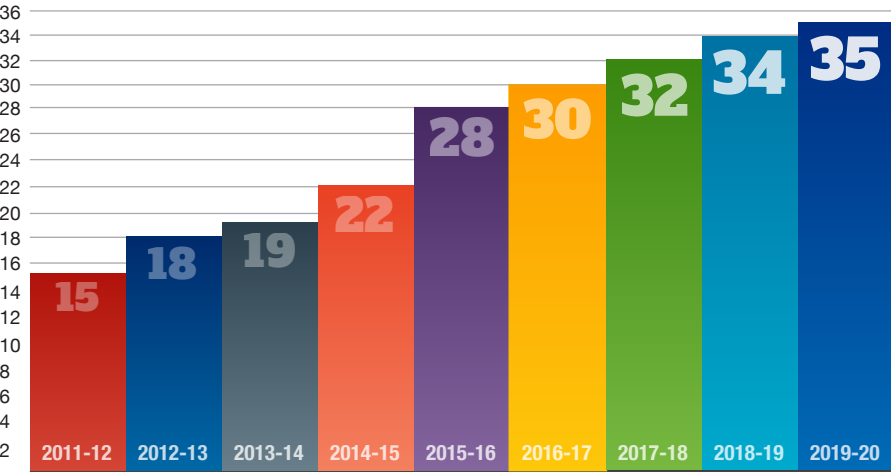
Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

In 2019, nearly 440 seniors from OCM BOCES’ component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including Jamesville-DeWitt students Maya Clewis, Nico Grosso, Theresa Johnson, Breanna Lobdell, Sophie Madison, Thomas Moade, and Leif Rosenholm.

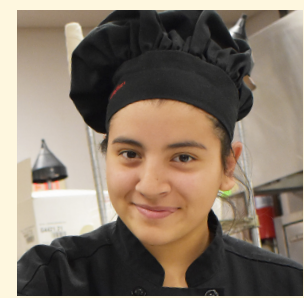
Number of classrooms in school district buildings that host BOCES Special Education Programs

When she was just a little girl, barely tall enough to peer over the kitchen counter, White Wolf Afraid of Bear says she was often amazed at the “magic” that occurred when her grandmother was cooking. First, she would see all the ingredients laid out: meats, vegetables, spices. Later, she would marvel at the end result: a delicious meal.

“I just loved the idea of that transformation,” White Wolf said.

Today, as a senior at Jamesville-DeWitt High School, White Wolf is in her second year in the culinary program at OCM BOCES. It is a fitting passion, she says, because everyone in her family cooks — her parents, her grandmother, and her three older siblings. In fact, her family once provided a catering service known for its chili and Buffalo burgers.

“The whole idea of cooking for other people, it just felt right to me,” she said. “So I wanted to continue that when I was older.”

Robert Canorro, her instructor, is impressed with White Wolf’s cooking skills, dedication and work ethic. He is especially pleased because White Wolf recently did an internship in the lunchroom of her high school, where the manager allowed her to work independently — an exceptional accomplishment — and described her as “the best intern she’s ever had,” Canorro said. He is also impressed with her maturity, recalling her early days in the program when she politely explained the origin of her Native American name, which combines the name of her father, an Akwesasne Mohawk, with the name of her mother, a Lakota Sioux.

After high school, White Wolf’s goal is to work part-time as a culinary specialist in the U.S. Army Reserves and continue her education at the Culinary Institute of America in Hyde Park. She is already practicing her skills as a line cook at Panera.

“Overall, this entire course is wonderful,” she said of her BOCES experience. “I’m so happy I’m doing it.”

Did You Know?

Jamesville-Dewitt is beginning the process of improving their school climate through the use of Restorative Practices with the assistance of our OCM BOCES Consultant Support Services team. This December, Jamesville-DeWitt educational leaders will engage in two days of professional development that will allow them to become turnkey trainers in the use of community building and restorative circles.
