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




Marathon's share of the 2019-20 **BOCES** administrative budaet \$27,502

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

In 2019, nearly 440 seniors from OCM BOCES' component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including Marathon students Zoe Carter, Stephanie Drake, Brittney Emeigh, Kassandra Farr, Johnathon Mann, Sierra Ostrander, Sebastian Rafferty, Darien Shepard, Jaime Shutts, Sullivan Whiting, and Theresa Wyak.

The consensus is clear among her instructors, peers, and the teachers she works with at the CAPCO Head Start in Cortland: Marathon senior Jenna Knout has become an outstanding leader through her work in the OCM BOCES Early Childhood Education program.

Inside the classroom, which is embedded inside the Cortland County Community Action Program (CAPCO), Jenna always goes "above and beyond" with her academic projects and consistently demonstrates a spirit of "teamwork, independence, and professionalism," said her teacher, Heather Tuttle.

"Jenna exuberates a natural talent for working with young children and has been able to build positive relationships with her peers and the classroom staff at CAPCO," Tuttle said.
