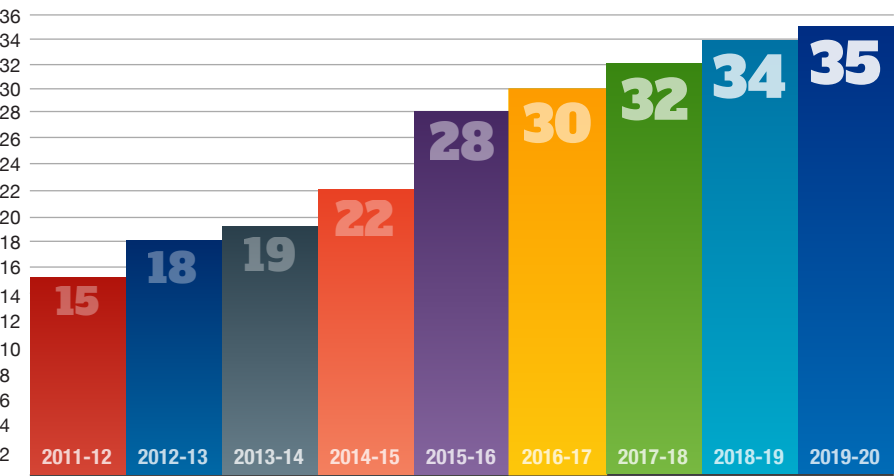
Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

In 2019, nearly 440 seniors from OCM BOCES’ component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including Marcellus students Luke Boskovski, Paul Colagiovanni, Sophia Donalds, Andrew Eddicus, Tora Fey, Drayden George, Haley Gurnsey, Zoe Hainey, Colin Herold, Christopher Hyatt, Kyler Kociela, Evan Kurfis, Edward Plogman, and Connor Trendowski.

Brian Randolph of Marcellus has benefitted in countless ways from the Special Education TEAM program at C.W. Baker High School in Baldwinsville. A dedicated team of OCM BOCES staff has helped him function independently, volunteer in the community, work at a local grocery store, participate in science lessons with his typical peers, and significantly improve his communication skills by using both sign language and an iPad.

His teacher, Lindsay Sprague, says Brian has taken on an important leadership role in his classroom by running the morning meeting, which requires him to navigate a SmartBoard. “He dances and cheers and completes the academic tasks on the board,” Sprague said. “He is a fun, lively student who brightens up our classroom!”

Outside the classroom, Brian has become a friendly and familiar face to students and staff at Baker. That’s because his daily responsibilities include delivering mail, making coffee, and turning in attendance records at the main office. Although he is non-verbal, “Brian is always walking the hallways, waving to all the students he passes and smiling,” Sprague said. “Everyone knows his name.”

He also enjoys a “Partners in Science” program that pairs him up with a typical student for hands-on experiments and discussions.

In addition to his academic work, Brian participates in bowling, swimming, kickball, and field trips. Most significantly, he recently started a job at Tops Friendly Markets, where an OCM BOCES job coach offers guidance as he stocks and organizes shelves while proudly wearing his company nametag.

“Brian has loved the opportunity to work at Tops, and it has given him a chance to apply the skills he has learned at school to a real-world job,” Sprague said. “Brian has learned how to be a productive and active member of the world, and he continues to grow each day.”

Did You Know?

Since the 2016-17 school year, the Marcellus Central School District has utilized an instructional coach to support first- and second-year teachers. Of the many benefits to in-district coaching, one of the greatest is the positive relationships formed between the coach and teachers. This foundation of trust and collaboration is the basis for professional growth using Daniel’s Effective Teaching Rubric. Other teachers in the district are also using coaching for Project-Based Learning, Responsive Classroom, and Instructional Support.
