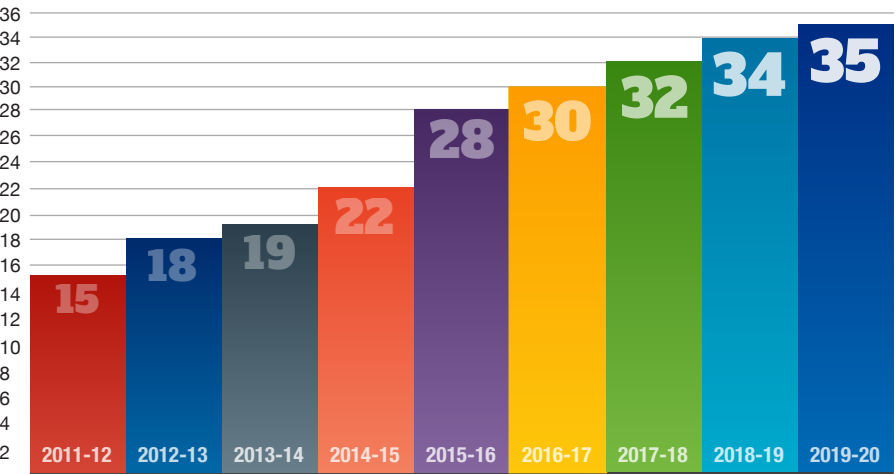
Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

In 2019, nearly 440 seniors from OCM BOCES’ component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including McGraw students Ethan Clendenning, Chase Curtis, Evan Czimback, Santana Deckard, Alyssa Libbey, and Samuel Parks.


Number of classrooms in school district buildings that host BOCES Special Education Programs

OCM BOCES & McGraw = Student Success



At Seven Valleys New Tech Academy in Cortland, OCM BOCES Facilitator Jenna Fleury describes one of her students, Victoria Lent, as “the embodiment of growth mindset,” a concept that touts the power of having an underlying belief in your ability to learn and grow.

“When she started at Seven Valleys three years ago, Victoria was not thinking of herself as someone who could be ‘good’ at school,” Fleury said. “Now she challenges herself to move forward and live at the edge of her comfort zone every day.”

Victoria, a senior, says she initially was shy about working with her peers and facilitators at Seven Valleys but eventually embraced the culture of the school. She especially enjoys the school's emphasis on Project Based Learning, where students work collaboratively on projects that have authentic, real-world connections. Over time, she has also become adept at directing her own learning, another tenant of the New Tech philosophy.

“Victoria thinks big but can break down projects into chunks so she can accomplish her goals,” Fleury said. “She is highly reflective when she thinks about her progress. She can analyze her learning and modify it for the future.”

This year, Victoria has grown into a leadership position at the school. She volunteers to work as an informal mentor to other students, takes initiative on projects, and serves as a positive role model to others, Fleury said.

Victoria says she is especially grateful to the staff at Seven Valleys for giving her the confidence to ask for help. She thinks that ability, as well as her improved communication skills, will help her when she goes to college. Her dream is to hone her passion for art so she can someday create character designs for video games.

“I’ve always had issues with asking for help or cuing someone into the fact that I need help,” she said. “But being at Seven Valleys has shown me that there is nothing wrong with asking for help. Everyone here wants me to succeed.”

Did You Know?

Teacher Leaders are working with and supporting their colleagues across all content areas to begin implementing a Standards-based curriculum by diving deeply into the Next Generation ELA and Math Standards, the NYS Science Learning Standards and the NYS Social Studies framework. They spent their fall Professional Learning Day with the support of OCM BOCES Instructional Support Services looking at the resources within the NYSED implementation toolkits. They started putting together a roadmap for building capacity to make sure students are ready for all the new state assessments that will be rolled out over the next several years.
